## RECORD IS MADE IN EXCAVATING

### STRENGTH OF PANAMA IS SCENE OF TREMENDOUS DIRT MOVING PARTY—MONTH OF AUGUST FIXES NEW RECORD

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 14.—Reports of a new record in excavating have just been received at the Isthmian Canal Commission, showing the highest monthly steam-shovel record since the beginning of American operations on the isthmus. Engineer J. H. LaRoue of Steam-shovel 557, working in the west burrow pit of Gatun dam, excavated during the month of August a total of \$6,644 cubic yards of earth and rock. A total of 2,422,353 cubic yards of earth in what is known as wet and dry excavation, was removed during the month of August. An average daily force of 15,696 men is maintained at present on the canal.

RESCUERS USE DIVING SUITS AND RESCUE SIX BODIES—MANY OTHERS BELIEVED TO HAVE SMOTHERED TO DEATH
