## BIG PROFITS ARE SECURED

PORT KLAMATH FARMERS RE-  
PORT A PROSPEROUS SEASON.  
THRASHING OPERATIONS HAVE  
BEEN COMPLETED

PT. KLAMATH, Oct. 17.—Thresh-  
ing is about over with in the valley. A  
few more days and the outfit will be  
put on the shelf until next season,  
when the increased acreage for next  
year will be sufficient to make a long  
and profitable run for the big outfit  
which was shipped in this season by  
Hurns & Cox.

J. W. Cox threshed twelve acres of  
timothy, the seed of which he sold  
for \$1,300, making him \$100 per  
acre for one crop.

The road work in this valley is be-  
ing pushed, with the object of com-  
pleting all the main roads before bad  
weather, and we are certainly going  
to have some excellent roads, both  
winter and summer.

Abner Weed has been up to his big  
ranch for several days, and has ar-  
ranged with Short Bros., who have  
the large steam plows, to plow sev-  
eral hundred acres for him this fall,  
which he will put in grain next spring.

Hay and grain of all kinds are  
cheap this year, and stock of all kinds  
is scarce, hence the big demand for  
cattle, and more especially milch  
cows, which, with the market and  
abundance of feed we have here,  
makes the dairy business very profit-  
able, even for the man with small  
means.

## GOVERNOR WANTS LAND FOR STATE

SALEM, Oct. 17.—Governor West  
has announced that at the next meet-  
ing of the state land board he will  
ask it to instruct the attorney general  
to bring suit against Benson & Hyde,  
timber operators, who during their  
operations in the state acquired from  
it about 50,000 acres of state land, to  
have them revert to the state on the  
ground of fraud.

The governor reached this decision  
upon receiving a decision from the  
commissioner of the general land of-  
fice in which he cancels the selection  
of government land made by the firm  
with land purchased from the state by  
Donald S. Sprague as a base. Benson  
& Hyde, during their operations in  
the state pursued the method of se-  
curing land from the state by  
having an individual purchase it and  
then assign it to them. Then they  
would be instrumental in having a  
forest reserve created which would  
embrace it and the next move would  
be to have the government issue scrip  
to them. This scrip was either used  
by them in making other selections or  
sold.

In the case of Sprague the commis-  
sioner holds as follows:  
"That said selection was fraudulent

and illegal in that the land offered as  
base for said selection was procured  
through fraudulent and corrupt prac-  
tices from the state of Oregon and in  
violation of the statutes regulating  
the sale of said lands, in that the ap-  
plication to the state for said land was  
not made for the use and benefit of  
Don S. Sprague, the applicant named,  
but for the use and benefit of F. A.  
Hyde, or one of his agents or some  
other person whose name is to the  
United States unknown, with the in-  
tent on the part of F. A. Hyde or one  
of his agents or some other person  
unknown to present same or that  
same should be presented to the United  
States in exchange for public lands  
of the United States in violation of the  
act of June 4, 1897."

Containing that if the fraud in the  
base is sufficient to cause the govern-  
ment to cancel the lieu selections it  
is sufficient to cause the state to can-  
cel the deeds made for the land con-  
stituting the base, the governor in-  
tends to ask the board to ask the at-  
torney general to begin suit to have  
all lands secured by the firm in this  
way to revert to the state on the  
ground of fraud.

## CONVICTS PROVE THE HONOR SYSTEM

BELLEFONTE, Pa., Oct. 17.—The  
principles of reformation underlying  
the plan of the new state penitentiary  
to be erected on the state tract of land  
three miles southeast of this place are  
being splendidly exemplified by thirty  
prisoners now engaged at the work of  
preparing for the building. These  
men were brought from the Western  
penitentiary at Allegheny five weeks  
ago, and are now engaged at outside  
work under the "upon your honor"  
plan that John Frances, the warden,  
hopes to see work out in the new pen-  
itentiary.

It is the purpose to give to every  
man who shows himself worthy of the  
confidence work out doors, within the  
walls of the institution, of course.  
This rule will apply to the grades of  
prisoners who are not sentenced to  
solitary confinement, or for crimes of  
a character that would preclude tak-  
ing any risk with them.

The thirty men who are engaged  
are prisoners in the sense of being un-  
der official surveillance, and at night  
they sleep in apartments arranged in  
one of the big old farm houses that  
are on the state tract. In it, besides  
the prisoners' quarters, are the execu-  
tive offices of the penitentiary.

When the men were brought to  
Bellefonte from Allegheny they were  
taken from the train a little outside of  
the town. Each man carried a basket

or bundle with his extra clothing  
therein, and they were marched to the  
country and to the buildings at the  
penitentiary site prepared for them.  
In less than two weeks something oc-  
curred to try out the honor standard,  
but every man of the thirty proved  
himself worthy of Frances' confidence  
and made no effort to escape.

The incident was the burning of a  
large barn on the penitentiary prop-  
erty, in which the stock was housed.  
The structure was set on fire by a  
stroke of lightning, and burned rap-  
idly. There was great excitement  
during the fire, and any man of the  
thirty might have escaped had he  
tried. When the call was sounded to  
return to their own quarters every  
man promptly reported, and every one  
showing the pride he felt at being ac-  
cording a chance to test his honor.

The men are engaged at doing pre-  
liminary work leading up to the be-  
ginning of the building operations.  
As fast as the work progresses to a  
stage where they can be set to work  
more convicts will be brought and  
set to work building roads, grading,  
quarrying, constructing stone walls  
and such other work as shall enter  
into the great plant. It is expected  
that next spring there will be experi-  
ments made in forestry, both in plant-  
ing and undercropping old growths.  
All this will be done by prisoners.
