### MAN ROLLS OFF A PLANK INTO BOILING WATER

#### HOLLENBECK MEETS WITH SERIOUS ACCIDENT

From Constant Service Guarding sheep, Herder Lays Down to Rest, But is Soon Awakened When His Body is Immersed in Hot Fluid. He is Rushed to Hospital, Where Surgeons are Called For.

John Hollenbeck, a sheep herder, while the boiling water at the hot spring in Hot Springs addition in this town about 12:30 this afternoon, and his right side was cooked almost to death. Several people who were in the vicinity were attracted by the cries of the injured man, and rushed to his assistance. He was taken to the hospital, where Dr. Wright is attending to his medical attention.

It was stated at the hospital this morning that while Hollenbeck was asleep, his injuries would be fatal.

### DOCTORS START FOR THE FRONT WITH WEAPONS

#### TYPHUS AND CHOLERA GERMS WILL BE TURNED LOOSE

Serious Charge is Made Against Turkish Authorities—Several Battles Have Been Fought—The Turks Are Believed to Have a Little the Best of the Encounter—One Army is Defeated

ATHENS, Oct. 18.—It is semi-officially stated here that Turkish surgeons are en route to Janina on the Greek frontier, armed with tubes filled with typhus and cholera germs, which will be turned loose on the enemy.

## Doctors Believe that Teddy Roosevelt is out of Danger

### Former President is Allowed to Sit Up for a Couple of Hours. His Running Mates Make Him a Visit No Politics Discussed in the Report

CHICAGO, Oct. 18.—At 1 o'clock it was announced that the physicians were pleased with the condition of Colonel Roosevelt, and no bulletin was issued at noon. The Colonel was permitted to sit up an additional hour. Governor Johnson, on entering the hospital, refused to comment on the shooting. He said: "You may say that, although I am not a prophet, judging from the reactions I have received everywhere I am confident that Roosevelt will be elected."

### SWINDLER SAYS LIFE THREATENED

#### HOMESTEADER SWEARS TO A COMPLAINT AGAINST THREE OF HIS NEIGHBORS—ROAD IS IN DISPUTE
