OTTERS NOW SAFE FROM TRAPPERS

GOVERNMENT DECIDES TO CLOSE
SEASON ON THIS ANIMAL IN-
DEFINITELY ALL OVER THE
STATE OF OREGON

The season for trapping all fur-
bearing animals in the Klamath Lake
reservation has been shortened twenty
days on the latter end, closing
March 1st instead of March 30th.

On account of other becoming rare,
not only on the Klamath Lake reser-
vation, but all over Oregon, the gov-
ernment has decided to close the sea-
son on that animal for an indefinite
period on all of the Oregon reser-
vations.

The order follows:

"To Whom It May Concern:

"It is hereby ordered that the fol-
lowing trapping seasons are to be in
force on the Klamath Lake reser-
vation for the seasons of 1912-1913,
ending March 1st, 1913, at which date
all traps must be removed from the
reservation.

"Mink, skunk, weasel, raccoon and
coyote, November 10th to March 1st.
"Otter closed indefinitely.

"Every one trapping must have a
permit from the department of agri-
culture, and must observe all regu-
lations of such permit.

"Application for permit may be had
by applying to warden in charge of
office of bureau of biological survey,
Pacific district, 909 Tom building,
Portland, Oregon.

MEASURE CREATES ANOTHER OFFICE

Resolved, by the Senate and House of
Representatives of the State of
Oregon:

That Section 5 of Article V of the
Constitution of the State of Oregon
be and the same is hereby amended
so as to read as follows:

Section 5. In the case of the im-
peachment of the governor, his death,
resignation, absence from the state or
inability to perform the duties of his
office, the same shall devolve upon
the lieutenant governor, who shall
serve until the disability be removed
or a governor elected. The lieutenant
governor shall be elected at the same
time and in the same manner, shall
serve for the same length of time and
shall possess the same qualifications
as the governor. He shall act as
president of the senate, and shall en-
joy such powers as may be conferred
upon him by law, but shall have no
vote upon the passage of bills or res-
olutions. He shall receive the same
compensation as the speaker of the
house during the sessions of the leg-
islative assembly, but shall receive no
other compensation except when called
upon to serve as governor, when he
shall receive the salary of that office.

In case of the impeachment, death,
resignation, absence from the state or
inability to act of both the governor
and lieutenant governor, the presi-
dent pro tem of the senate shall serve
as governor until the disability be re-
moved or a governor elected, and in
case of the impeachment, death, res-
ignation, absence from the state or
inability to act on the part of the gov-
ernor, lieutenant governor and the
president pro tem of the senate, the
speaker of the house shall serve as
governor until the disability be re-
moved or a governor elected.

Upon the adoption of this amend-
ment the president of the senate shall
not as lieutenant governor until the
people at the general election in the
year 1914, choose a lieutenant gov-
ernor.

Section 5 of Article V of the state
Constitution vests in the secretary of
state the duties of the governorship
in the event of the death, removal,
resignation or inability to act on the
part of the governor. This proposed
amendment creates the office of lieuten-
ant governor, defines the powers and
duties of that official and pro-
vides for an orderly and business like
succession to the governorship in the
event of the death, removal, resigna-
tion, etc., of the chief executive.

We believe that the proposed

amendment should be adopted for
the following reasons:

1. It will prevent the secretary of
state from holding two offices at the
same time and having two votes out
of three on the state land board and
other important boards and commis-
sions, as he does now. The present
arrangement is unwholesome, almost
unprecedented and not in keeping with
the principles of good government.
No public official, however trustwor-
thy, should exercise the power and
authority of two important offices.

2. It will relieve the secretary of
state from doing double duty in the
event of his succession of the govern-
orship. Either position carries with
it duties and responsibilities sufficient
to fully occupy the time of a most
capable man, and it is not in the in-
terests of good government and
sound business policy to continue the
present arrangement and undertake
to require a man to do work which it
is impossible for him to perform.

3. It will not permit one man to
hold two important offices, draw two
large salaries at the same time, when
by the very nature of things he can-
not do the work, and therefore is not
entitled to the two salaries.

It will provide for the carrying on
of the work of the governor's office
in the event of the death, resignation,
etc., of the governor, without demor-
alizing the work in the office of the
secretary of state.

5. It will provide for a logical and
orderly succession to the governor-
ship, such as practically all other
states in the Union now enjoy. The
succession will be as follows: First,
governor; second, lieutenant gov-
ernor; third, president pro tem of the
senate (which office will be created
by law); fourth, speaker of the
house.

6. It will eliminate the biennial
struggle for the presidency of the
state senate, and will put an end to
the political trades, secret deals and
combinations that have frequently
been witnessed in this connection, for
the sovereign people will elect their
lieutenant governor, who will act as
the presiding officer of the senate. It
has been stated by opponents of the
proposed amendment that the people
of other states have sometimes elect-
ed inferior men to the office of lieuten-
ant governor, and therefore, it is
argued, the people are incapable of
electing a good man for the office in
Oregon. We are confident that the
people of this state are just as compe-
tent to choose a lieutenant governor
as they are to choose a governor, sen-
ator, congressman or other public
official.
