WEEKLY SERMON

True Religion

(By Rev. J. H. Stubbins, First Presbyterian Church)

Pure religion and undefiled before
God and the Father is this: "To visit
the fatherless and widows in their
affliction and to keep himself un-
spotted from the world."—Jas. 1:27.

Pure and undefiled religion is the
sort the people of Klamath Falls
need. It is what the people all over
this country are looking for. I am
not surprised to find many sticklers
for pure religion, because our gener-
ation has become surfeited with sub-
stitutes. There is a general move-
ment all along the line for that which
is pure. Dr. Wiley embodies the feel-
ings of the American people in his de-
mand for pure food. Much of our
adulterated food that has been offered
as a substitute for the pure stuff
is just about as nauseating to the
healthy stomach as our substitute
religions are to the healthy soul.

Adulterated medicine can do no
more harm to the body than adulter-
