SELECTS SITE FOR CHINA BUILDING

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 1.—"In the name of the Republic of China, I plant this flag to accept this land upon which shall rise the government building which China will dedicate to the celebration of the successful construction of the Panama canal by the United States," declared Dr. Chin-tao Chou, commissioner general of China, when he dedicated China's site at the Panama-Pacific International Exposition.

As he uttered these words the heavy guns of the Presidio thundered a salute, the first fired in this country to the still unrecognized republic.

Fully 20,000 people were present, among them being a large percentage of the Chinese population of this city and vicinity.

WHY VOTE FOR WILSON?

There was a time in American history when the name "democrat" was considered a staple article, but it was a long time ago—in fact, more than half a century. There are many who yet love the sacred name, but shudder at its unobserved opportunities and fruitless results. About the year 1844 it began to wander from the path of prosperity, and finally, about 1860, abstracted at zero. The sleep was peaceful until 1884, when it two-thirds awoke and received the thanks of the United States senate for not unloosing the shoestrings of free trade. On March 4, 1893, lovely morning with a blue sky, the republicans staggered out, and the democrats jumped in, from whence the American people's troubles began. The clock stopped. The splines of all industry refused to turn. Banks failed. Securities took a tumble. The ratchets would not hold. Five thousand dollars in gold dust would not get \$500 in cash at a local bank not seventy-five miles from Klamath Falls. Good improved land was not worth \$5 an acre. Mortgages were out of the question. Rich men begged for \$20, and poor ones begged for anything to satisfy their stomachs. However, there were no labor strikes, for which democratic supremacy is a sure cure. In fact, financial, commercial, and industrial activities ceased for want of money and market. No sales nor purchases. Eastern Oregon occupied a fortunate part of Uncle Sam's domain, as it had but few people and small properties to lose at the period mentioned. Most all parts of the United States the loss and suffering was greater than in Klamath. It is different now. Ten thousand people and \$16,000,000 property in sixteen years of republican supremacy. Industries, large and small, springing into existence. Lumbering interests at present are employing 600 to 800 men, either directly or indirectly. Timber interest, just in its infancy, and the sole future of Klamath county, will at its maturity reach such magnitude as to even surprise ourselves. Now will the intelligent voter cast his ballot in a manner that will stagnate, or even depress, our possibilities. Wilson is only a creature of the Webster of America, the Boy of the Platte, W. J. Bryan, who encountered defeat three times for want of confidence. Who but Bryan nominated Wilson? Who wrote his platform? Bryan. Who dominated the Baltimore convention? Bryan. Who openly served notice on Murphy and Ryan delegates from New York that no man whom they supported would or could be nominated at the Baltimore convention? Bryan. Upon receipt of the news of Wilson's nomination some of the rankest democrats of Klamath openly proclaimed that they would not support him, but for some unobserved reason they are doing so. Within a radius of twenty miles of this city there are at least 100 democrats that openly admit that in case of Wilson's election it will necessarily impose hard times, and yet they are going to favor him with their support. No doubt the word "democrat" is endearing to a person of that faith, but is it possible that public spirited citizens will forget their country in order to remember their party. It probably appears through the manipulation and intervention for the one-man party—the Roosevelt of America—likened unto the Napoleon of Europe—that the fat salaries of paid servants are visible in the distance. But will it pay? Is it good business sagacity? Realizing the importance and openly admitting the results, a safe and sane vote would at least secure a clear conscience of duty to country and God for a future keepsake. A vote for Taft is the logical sane manner in which to continue the present prosperity at hand.
