OCEAN LETTER IS A NEW FEATURE

TRAVELERS ON GERMAN VESSELS GIVEN PRIVILEGE OF SENDING THIRTY WORDS TO FOLKS AT HOME

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 8.—The "Ocean Letter," a new delayed wireless telegraph service, is the latest thing since Cyrus Field laid the first trans-Atlantic cable.

An outbound traveler on a German vessel wishing to communicate with his friends or business connection at home, writes a letter of thirty words or more, which is transmitted by wireless from a vessel on which the traveler is to the nearest homeward-bound German vessel.

The service was first tried on the steamers of the Hamburg-American line plying to and from South America. The charge is \$1.19 for the first thirty words, and 3 1/2 cents for each additional word.
