TURKS WIN A FEW VICTORIES IN THE BALKANS

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 11.—Washington officials have ordered Rear Admiral Knight, commanding the cruisers Montana and Tennessee, to sail for Constantinople tomorrow.

Turks Get a Town

CONSTANTINOPLE, Nov. 11.—The Turks claim that they have recaptured Rodos. They say that the Turkish warships bombarded the place while 5,000 Turkish soldiers landed and drove the Bulgarians back.

PARIS, Nov. 11.—It is understood that Turkey has approved a plan for the temporary joint occupation of Constantinople. The plan permits the landing of troops from the ships of the powers, ostensibly to protect the city, but really to keep the Bulgarians out of the city. It is believed that the landing of troops will be ordered soon. Reports that Christians were massacred in Constantinople Saturday are evidently untrue.

LONDON, Nov. 11.—Bulgaria's answer to Turkey's request for terms of peace has not been learned. As fighting is still in progress at the Chatalja forts, it is believed that Bulgaria has demanded unconditional surrender.

### Willis Wins Verdict for Fire Insurance

### Lake County Jury Decides that Well Known Man did not Burn Own Store—Gets Verdict \$6,000

Judgment was rendered in favor of the plaintiff in the case of the Willis Furniture company vs. the Horticulture Fire Relief of Oregon, which has been on trial in Lakeview during the past week. The case was given to the jury late Saturday afternoon, and at 1 o'clock Sunday morning the verdict for the plaintiff was returned. The action was brought to recover \$6,000 on an insurance policy. It grew out of the burning of the old Snider opera house in Lakeview. Mr. Willis was arrested on a charge of perjury, and was tried in this city. He was acquitted, and then suit was started to recover the insurance. J. C. Ruskopf of this city and W. Lair Thompson of Lakeview represented the plaintiff.

### AEROPLANES TO BE USED IN WAR

PLAN IS SUGGESTED OF ESTABLISHING A CHAIN OF THE MACHINES ALONG THE PACIFIC COAST FOR PROTECTION

### "SCOTTY'S" PAST IS MADE PUBLIC

MYSTERY OF WEALTH OF MINERAL CHARACTER REVEALED—KNOWN DURING YEARS OF A CRIMINAL ACTION

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 11.—Walter Scott, better known as "Death Valley Scotty," is no longer a man of mystery, following his testimony before Superior Judge Frank E. Willis, in the trial of F. C. Goodwin, secretary of the Death Valley Scotty Mining and Development company, for perjury. Scotty told his life's story from his beginning as a cowboy in Nevada, up to the present time. He testified that Goodwin was the promoter of the alleged fraudulent company formed to purchase a mythical mine in Nevada, owned by Scotty, and that he, Scotty, had signed a receipt for \$25,000 as a first payment on the mine, whereas he only received \$200, and expected no more.
