### ASKED TO TRY CASES IN COURT

ROSEBURG COUNCILMEN RESENT THE INTERFERENCE OF THE STATE EXECUTIVE—RESOLUTION IS ADOPTED

ROSEBURG, Nov. 19.—Governor Oswald West's attack on Mayor Joseph Micelli of Roseburg brought forth reproach from the city council in the form of a resolution introduced by Councilman J. C. Fullerton, former circuit judge of this district, and was adopted by unanimous vote. In spite of the publication of Salem dispatches saying that the governor had requested Mayor Micelli to resign, and later that he had requested District Attorney Brown to prosecute the mayor for alleged malfeasance in office, the mayor says that he has yet to receive a single word from the governor in relation to the matter. Micelli declines to make a statement as to what he will do until he receives official notice direct from Governor West. The resolution adopted follows:

"Whereas, Governor Oswald West has repeatedly stated in the last few weeks through the newspapers in substance and effect that the mayor, and incidentally the other officers of the city of Roseburg, have failed and neglected to perform the duty enjoined upon them by law, and that it has become necessary for him to use his authority that he assumes is vested in him to clean up the town and compel the county and city officers to perform the duties required of them; and

"Whereas, These statements published broadcast throughout the country, emanating from the governor of the state, are calculated to and do in fact injure the good name and business of the city and cause people residing elsewhere to gather the impression that Roseburg is lawless and immoral, and an unfit place for the homes of law-abiding, self-respecting people, a place where the officers fail to perform their duty and wink at and approve violation of the law; and

"Whereas, In truth and in fact Roseburg is a law-abiding and well-governed as any city in the state, and violators of the law are as speedily and severely punished as elsewhere in the state, and the statements made by the governor to the contrary are a slander upon the city of Roseburg and its officers; therefore, be it

"Resolved, by the common council of the city of Roseburg, duly assembled, That Governor West be and hereby is requested to try any criminal or civil actions he may have against the officers or inhabitants of the city of Roseburg, in the courts, and not through the papers, and that the recorder of the city be and hereby is instructed to transmit a copy of this resolution, attested by the seal of the city, to Governor Oswald West at Salem, Ore."

OFFICIAL FIGURES SHOW CANDIDATE FOR UNITED STATES SENATOR SPENT ONLY \$722.60 IN HIS FIGHT

SALEM, Nov. 19.—It cost Ben Selling \$722.60 to conduct his campaign as republican candidate for United States senator, according to his statement. F. W. Mulkey, who aspired for the bull moose nomination for United States senator, and circulated a petition which he never filed, filed a statement showing expenditures of \$772.09.

M. G. Munley, democratic candidate for congress in this district, spent \$726.25, while W. C. Hawley, successful republican candidate for reelection to congress in the First district, spent \$746.99.

### DYNAMITE CAST INTO THE OCEAN

McMANIGAL TELLS OF HIS PART IN NUMEROUS OUTRAGES—HE SAYS THAT TRITMORE KNEW OF THE PLOTS

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 21.—Ortis McManigal was recalled to the stand shortly before noon today in the trial of the labor leaders on charges of illegally transporting dynamite. He resumed his description of the different jobs of dynamiting. He testified that Jim McNamara declared when he left San Francisco, following the Times building explosion in Los Angeles, he dropped a suit case containing four infernal machines into San Francisco bay. He said that Tritmore was to meet John McNamara at the ironworkers convention in St. Louis, and tell him the details of the Times building explosion.

The defense may forbid Hochkin testifying. The defendants are silent, but it is expected that there have been serious disagreements.
