FACTIONAL FIGHT IS ON SCHEDULE

DEMOCRATIC SENATORS WILL
ENGAGE IN A BATTLE FOR HON-
ORS ON THE DIFFERENT COM-
MITTEES IN A BELL

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 22.—
Senators returning to Washington be-
fore convention of congress predict
that one of the most bitter, factional
fights between democrats after March
4th will be for the control of the
senate finance committee, the tariff
making body of the upper branch of
congress. Upon the selection of the
chairman and democratic personnel of
this important committee, it was
pointed out, rests not only on the
date of any real tariff regulation or
reduction by the Wilson administra-
tion, but also probably upon the
make-up of many other important
senate committees.

Senator Simmons of North Caro-
lina is the "ranking" democrat on
the finance committee, whose chair-
man is now Senator Boies Penrose of
Pennsylvania. By right of seniority,
which is jealously adhered to by the
senate, Senator Simmons is entitled
to the chairmanship when the republi-
cans step down March 4 because of

the democratic majority in the
senate.

But Senator Simmons is regarded
as a "reactionary stand-pat" dem-
ocrat. He is a protectionist on many
schedules. He has often voted with
the republicans on tariff matters, to
prevent radical tariff reduction leg-
islation. He is also not in close com-
munion with the leaders of the Wil-
son movement.

Senator Gore, the blind senator
from Oklahoma, "original" Wilson
man, and strongly progressive, is
picked as a possible opponent to Sim-
mons for the finance chairmanship.
Gore is a close friend of the president
elect.

Efforts to name senators as mem-
bers of the finance committee who are
real "progressives" as to tariff leg-
islation will provoke a lively fuss, it
is declared. If the seniority rule is
abolished and Simmons denied the
chairmanship, it is probable that the
precedent may be followed in other
senate committees, and a straight
square issue of progressivism versus
conservatism between the democratic
majority factions.

The various committee chairmen
and members will be chosen when the
next congress convenes at a dem-
ocratic caucus.

Gov. Wilson's friends are said to
be concerned over the possibility
that "reactionary" democrats may
secure control of the finance and other
senate committees, and be in a po-
sition to defeat the Wilson tariff re-
duction plan and other "progressive
legislation."
