NEW ASYLUM TO BE OPEN JAN. 1

WORK AT PENDLETON ON STATE INSTITUTION IS BEING HURRIED. BUILDING WILL SOON BE READY FOR OCCUPANCY

PENDLETON, N. V. 22.—Ever preparation is being made for the occupancy of the Eastern Oregon branch hospital by the first of the new year. Contractors Olson & Johnson are now putting the finishing touches to the building, the painting and plastering are all done, the heating plant is in operation and the equipment is beginning to arrive. Last week a shipment of 4,000 pounds of dishes and 400 mattresses was received. The beds are on the way.

CALIFORNIA GOVERNOR IS SOME; FEEKED WHEN COURT DECISION GOES AGAINST HIS OWN INDIVIDUAL INTERESTS

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 22.—Democrats today claim the state for Wilson because of the decision of the appellate court that tallies and not the official returns be counted. Nothing definite will be known until Secretary of State Jordan makes the official announcement.

Governor Hiram Johnson wired to Myer Lissner, denouncing the decision of the court, saying that it was due to the efforts of "hired thugs at the polls." He urged that the progressive fight be conducted vigorously.

number that Klamath Falls is destined to be a city, and an unsightly market place is not an attraction in the very heart of any community.

"It is the custom for each city to provide its own parks. Klamath county should not be required to perform this service for Klamath Falls, a city well able to stand on its own hind legs."

Pioneers who have seen the trees in the square grow from slips to giants naturally are opposed to any plan which would mean the cutting down of trees, and favor the park idea. They appear, however, to be a small minority, indicated by the letters to the county court.

MOVIES TO BE MADE OF CANAL

GOVERNMENT AUTHORIZES THE TAKING OF PICTURES WHICH WILL BE ON EXHIBITION AT CAPITAL THIS WINTER

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 22.—The first official moving pictures taken by the government of the Panama canal are now being secured by the house appropriations committee. A moving picture operator and also a photographer from the United States geological survey, are members of the congressional inspection party touring the canal zone.

"Movies" of the big construction work are to be exhibited in Capitol committee rooms this winter, to illustrate graphically the necessity for appropriations. Fortification plans will also be illustrated in the pictures.

Secretary of War Stimson, by a peculiar coincidence, is also inspecting the canal work while the house committee is looking over the project. A considerable part of the secretary's annual report to the president this winter is to be devoted to the canal, as the Taft administration's "last word" on Panama.
