MEAT WAR CUTS LIVING COST

BUTCHERS IN SEATTLE ARE ENGAGED IN A BATTLE WHICH RESULTS IN A SAVING TO THE CONSUMERS

Cattlemen throughout Oregon are vitally interested in a big meat war which is now in progress in Seattle. One of the big packing houses of the city introduced retail markets and began cutting the prices of meat, believing that by so doing they could not only reduce the cost of living, but at the same time materially increase the consumption.

Independent butchers tried to make the packing houses cut out its retail markets. The packing house refused, with the result that the meat war began. On account of the high price of beef in the Eastern market last summer and fall there has been created in the Northwest a scarcity of cattle; cattle which would ordinarily have come to the Western market went East.

There is not enough cattle to go around. The prediction is made that within a few months local retailers will be compelled to pay a far bigger price for their cattle than were paid by the Eastern dealers a few months ago. Certainly the meat war which is now on in Seattle has reduced the cost of living. Meat which a few weeks ago was selling for 20 and 25 cents a pound can now be had for 10, 15 and 20 cents. Never in the history of the city has so much meat been sold as during the past two weeks. There is no indication that the war will soon end. On the contrary, there is every indication that it will continue for six months.

STATES DIVIDE \$500,000 FUND

FEDERAL APPROPRIATION TO BE FOR THE BENEFIT OF ALL OF THE STATES THAT CO-OPERATE IN ROAD MOVEMENT

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 25.—The half million dollars appropriated by Congress at the last session for improvement of roads will be distributed among states that co-operate with the federal government in this work.

The cabinet has decided that the money shall be allotted among all the states, on the basis of \$10,000 to each state that agrees to spend \$20,000 of its own funds. It is thought a few states will not be able to raise the required amount.

RELEASED TO CLAIM FORTUNE

WASHINGTON PRISONER IS DISCHARGED SO THAT HE MIGHT GO EAST TO GET SHARE OF \$200,000 LEFT BY FATHER

TACOMA, Nov. 25.—It has just been made public that Henry Gable, sentenced in December, 1907, to serve from five to twenty years in the penitentiary, was pardoned by Governor Hay on November 8, that the man might go back to a little Minnesota town to claim a third interest in an estate of \$200,000 left by his father.

Gable was arrested in Tacoma with a woman, charged with the robbery of an elderly farmer. Gable claimed he was not implicated in the robbery, but his father refused to aid him, and he went to prison, claiming to be a victim of circumstances. He made a model prisoner, and was given a warm welcome in his Minnesota home by his nine children.

BARTENDER IS SOAKED HARD

PORTLAND MAN FINDS THAT IT DOES NOT PAY TO SELL LIQUOR TO AN INDIAN—GETS JAIL SENTENCE WITH FINE

Indians from this section who go to Portland to testify in the federal court are not going to find it so easy to procure liquor as they appear to have in the past. This was indicated last week when Judge Bean assessed Clinton Tuttle, a bartender, a fine of \$100 and 60 days in the Multnomah county jail.

Last spring Henry Wilson went to Portland from here as a government witness. He secured so much booze while in the state metropolis that he was of very little service to the government.

Agent Watson of the reservation went to Portland as a witness in the case against the bartender, who pleaded guilty to the charge.

LAKE COUNTY MAN ESCAPES

FORMER REAL ESTATE DEALER BREAKS OUT OF KERN COUNTY JAIL AFTER CONVICTION OF A SERIOUS CRIME

Bernard C. Min, a former real estate man of this and Lake counties, who was sentenced to five years in San Quentin for obtaining money under false pretenses, escaped from the Kern county jail, with three other prisoners, last week, says the Alturas News.

They drugged the jailer, then sawed their way out of jail and let themselves down a 30-foot wall by a blanket rope. Three possums are in pursuit.

LAKE COUNTY GIVES MONEY

APPROPRIATION OF \$500 IS MADE FOR THE AID OF THE CENTRAL OREGON DEVELOPMENT LEAGUE

Lake county court was one of the first to make an appropriation for the Central Oregon Development League. The Examiner of Lakeview has the following to say of the matter:

The county court in its regular session last week appropriated \$500 to assist in the experimental and development work of dry farming for Lake county, as was undertaken by the Central Oregon Development League in connection with the work of the Oregon Agricultural College. The money was directed to be sent to C. S. Hudson, Bend, Oregon, who is treasurer of the League.

This is a very commendable move on the part of Lake county officials, and one that will prove of great benefit to the entire county. It has not been determined as to where the work will be practiced.

Looks Prosperous

The farmers have been hauling in their wheat, oats and barley in a lively manner during the past week, and Martin Bros. have their warehouses full and every other place they can find to store grain, says the Merrill Record. Their warehouses at Midland and Klamath Falls are full, and it is impossible for them to get cars at the present time to ship the surplus grain.

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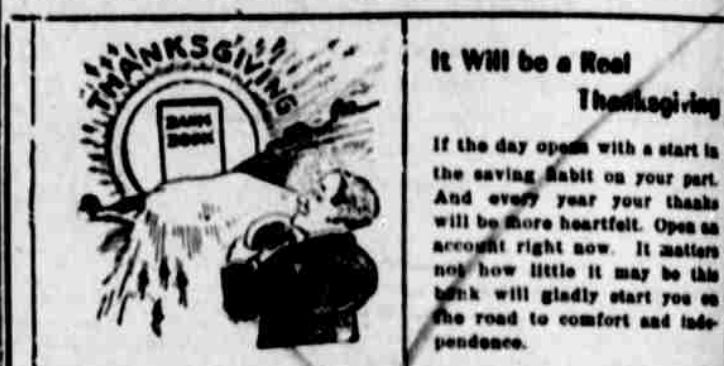
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
