J. RUFUS TYPE OF MAN PINCHED

CLEVER ENGLISHMAN IS IN CUSTODY AS A RESULT OF SOME HIGH FINANCE OPERATIONS IN PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Nov. 25.—J. Byrne, the clever high finance operator and competitor of J. Rufus Wallingford, who was arrested by the postal authorities in Seattle recently, has been indicted by the federal grand jury on a charge of securing \$500 from W. F. Chenot of St. Louis, Mo., under the false pretense that he represented extensive English capital.

Byrne was arrested only a few days ago in Seattle on similar charges, and is awaiting the action of the grand jury there. He may be removed to this district for his trial.

The case against Byrne is made up mainly of letters written by the supposed European agent, acknowledging the receipt of money paid him for examining property of the American Ookerite company in Utah and of the Twin Falls Orchard company of Twin Falls, Idaho. Other letters, in which he asks for money, also are in the hands of the government.

Not in some years has an operator been as clever as Byrne worked on the Pacific coast. Dressed well and modestly and armed with telegrams, vouchers and credentials supposed to come from European houses of unquestionable standing, Byrne approached those who have ventures to promote as a conservative business man with unlimited capital behind him.

That money is being driven out of England by the new tax laws and that capitalists in the old country are highly desirous of transferring their business to America, is one of the statements of the high financier.

He represents that his clients are looking for a solid investment and that they rely wholly upon his, Byrne's word. Hence an exhaustive examination must be made before money is spent. Here is where Byrne's little graft comes in. Finally convincing his victim that he is really what he appears to be, the defendant is alleged, asks for \$100 or \$200 to be paid an examiner to go and look over the property. In many cases this is granted. The examiner is never sent out, but a few weeks later Byrne writes the promoter that he has received a favorable report, and that he is very much satisfied. However, he must have further information. He sends for illustrated booklet, etc., to send back to his clients. After much cogitation he requires another assignment of money, and thus it goes on until he has exhausted the patience and capital of the man with whom he is dealing. Then he moves to newer fields.

In one letter Chenot writes that he has disposed of valuable property and been forced to borrow to meet the demands of Byrne.

H. G. Durand, postoffice inspector, was the only witness before the grand jury. Durand was recently in Seattle to see Byrne.

BEAUTIFUL HOMES FEATURE OF U. S.

CLUB WOMAN TELLS OF THE PLACE OF WOMEN IN HOME: LIFE OF AMERICA—UGLINESS IN MISDETERMINED

MILWAUKEE, Wis., Nov. 22.—That the impulse toward the creation of beautiful homes is stronger in America than in any other country, and that the women here lead all the world in devotion to domestic affairs was stated yesterday afternoon by Mrs. W. F. Loeb of Beloit in an address on "The Fine Art of Living" before the Social Economic Club in the Athenaeum.

Mrs. Loeb asserted that the question of woman suffrage dominates every other social problem today. Her address was in part as follows:

"Fortunately for the world, millionaires are in the minority. Most folks are born to the blessed inheritance of labor. Therefore, for the most of us, it becomes necessary that we should acquire our art in the midst of our work.

"A woman's home is her workshop. The workshop unconsciously reveals the soul of the worker. A woman expresses her highest spiritual attainment in her home. Whether she wishes to be or not, every woman is an artist in her degree. For art is not oil paintings and statuary. Neither is it the password of a cult, nor the plaything of the rich. Art is emotion, heart-sense, and the absolute soul hunger of every intelligent being. Beauty is feeling properly expressed. Ugliness is feeling improperly expressed.
