"SHOUTS" STATE PRINTER

UNWAY SAYS THAT STATE PRINTING EXPERT IS A MEMBER OF THE ANANIAN CLUB—PRINTING CONTROVERSY IS ON

SEASIDE, Nov. 28.—Fortified by a letter from R. A. Harris, state printing expert, Secretary of State Olcott has announced that he will make a return of 50 per cent in four bills printed by State Printer Dunway in relation to the printing of the state's publicity pamphlets.

Harris in his letter to the secretary of state says that the four bills aggregated \$487.54, and that he is given to understand that the secretary of state at the time of giving the original order for the pamphlets advised the printer to preserve the copies, as more pamphlets might be needed. He declares that in the submitted the state printer has used an amount which would be equal to doing the work all over again, and recommends that a 50 per cent reduction be made.

In replying to Harris' letter State Printer Dunway says:

"Harris simply lies when he says I promised to carry the forms for two weeks without pay. No printing office could run under such conditions. If the state would have paid me to make me carry in type and press all of the various orders of printing that come in it would soon

bankrupt me, and that is what is desired by a certain element. I shall always follow the laws, and shall insist that Harris do likewise."

Discovering that a pledge given to Secretary of State by R. A. Harris, state printing expert, to the effect that he would guarantee that Harry Hill would file vouchers as to the expenditures made by the element led by Harris in fighting the state printer's flat salary bill had been eliminated from the records, State Printer Dunway has written a letter to the secretary of state asking that a duplicate be filed.

When Hill filed the expense account it was discovered that it was not in compliance with the law, inasmuch as no vouchers were filed. To insure the filing of vouchers by Hill, Harris wrote out a pledge and left it with the secretary of state, and this now has disappeared from the records according to the allegations of Dunway. He says that copies were taken from it, and he asks that one now be filed, and further asks to be advised if any expense statement has been filed which complies with law.

TURKS CHANGE CONSTITUTION

AFTER FOUR YEARS OF OPERATION UNDER IT, CABINET DECIDES TO ABROGATE CONSTITUTION OF THE COUNTRY
