## BALL PLAYERS ARE IN VICINITY

W. E. ROGERS AND W. E. SHANGLIN OF THE PORTLAND TEAM ARE SPENDING THE WINTER TRAPPING NEAR LA PINE

Camped at the Wikipa, northwest of La Pine, for the past two weeks, are W. E. Rogers, captain of Portland's famous ball team, the Beavers, and W. E. Shangle, the team's trainer, who was once the world's champion foot racer. They have comfortable quarters in the cabin there, and have enough supplies to last them until the middle of February, when they will pull out for Portland, says the La Pine Inter-Mountain. They are hunting ducks and trapping, and claim to be having the time of their lives.

These famous athletes were discovered by D. L. Peterson of La Pine about dusk last Thursday while he was chasing down the Big River, which had strayed from its bed some time during the night before, and was lost. Mr. Shangle made a statement which Mr. Peterson believes should be widely quoted by the Oregon Press. He said that in his younger days he traveled extensively, and has been in all the nations on the globe. He has inspected the world's most famous scenic regions, but none of them, even in the United States or Alaska, begin to compare with the beauties of Crane Prairie, twenty-five miles west of La Pine. Mr. Shangle made his first visit to the pretty spot a week ago.

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## Work on the Oregon Trunk to be Started

### Great Activity is Noted in the Vicinity of La Pine and it is Believed that Construction Work will Begin

Reports from the north indicate that construction of the Oregon Trunk south from Bend will be started up again very soon. This work was discontinued in May, 1919, but from time to time there has been indications of renewed activity, but it was not until the last few days that there has appeared to be any certainty of the work being rushed.

The mystery of the appearance of so many different crews of cutters who have been operating for the timber interests in the Walker Basin the past two months is in a way explained when it is recalled that these large timber corporations are in touch with railroad circles, and the evident fact that they would not be putting forward the extraordinary exertions without the purpose of being prepared for the coming of the railroad.

George Nelson, of the firm of Nelson Brothers, who had a sub-contract in the spring of 1919 for constructing forty miles of the road—seven miles north of Bend to La Pine—has been in Bend the past week. Rumors have been rampant in that town for over a month that operations are to begin shortly, and bets are being made as to the time. At the Hotel La Pine last Thursday night was a guest who in the spring of 1919 had a contract to clear thirty miles of the right of way. The man was A. Anderson of Portland. He arrived late, and after eating a light supper, retired. He was recognized, and when questioned as to the purpose of his visit, finally admitted that he was looking over the line for Rierison, who still has the clearing contract from Bend to La Pine, he said.

## NEW CHARTER IS BEFORE COUNCIL

FAVORABLE ACTION IS TAKEN AND AN ELECTION WILL BE HELD MARCH 16—INJUNCTION SUIT IS NOW PENDING

The new aldermanic charter, which has been under preparation for several months, was presented to the city council last night. Without opposition the charter was ordered and an election ordered to pass on the measure March 10th.

This morning reports were rife to the effect that the people who favor a commission form of government were preparing to prevent the election by a legal action.

In the ordinance presented last night it is provided that the result of the charter election shall be canvassed March 16th, and, in the event of the action of the voters being favorable, the new charter is to become effective at once.

The bill of J. J. Knapp for services rendered in preparing plans for a proposed new city hall was again presented to the city council. Attorney Mills made a plea for the payment of the bill, but the councilmen were of the opinion that Mr. Knapp had agreed to do the work, waiting for his pay until such time as the city hall bonds were sold.

Charles Meldrum, city electrician, was granted a vacation from December 8 to 21.

Bids were received for a fire whistle, and were referred to a committee consisting of Councilmen Savidge, Crisler and Huson.

A proposal to cut the salary of the city physician from \$50 to \$35 a month was referred to the finance committee.
