White Urges Land to be Kept by County

Declares that the Law Will not Permit the Proceeds of the Sale to be Used Toward Construction Court House

Editor Herald:
I have been surprised that in all that has been published about the disposal of the court house block it has been assumed that the amount realized in case of sale would be applied to cost of construction of the new building. Not being a lawyer, my interpretation of the law may be questioned, but I have an opinion, nevertheless. The law seems to be perfectly plain that the money used in building a court house must be raised by direct taxation under a specific levy for that purpose. While county property may be sold, the amount realized from such sale must go into the general fund, according to law. Certainly a straw vote cannot authorize a different procedure, however much a great many citizens might desire the money used in lieu of a direct levy for building the new court house.
I favor retention of the property by the county and its use for beneficial purposes in which citizens of the county would share. A library building, with a basement designed and equipped as a house of public comfort, would certainly prove convenient and desirable to the people of the county. It is unfortunate that some persons desiring the sale of the property have appealed to the selfish and prejudicial instincts of taxpayers. Growth and development of the city along broad and proper lines is something in which every farmer of the county should feel a personal friendly interest. Likewise intensive farming development, extension of irrigable areas, better drainage and good roads in the country for economic marketing of the crops are matters in which

DIME NOVELS WORRY GERMANS

MINISTER OF EDUCATION ISSUES A DECREE URGING PARENTS TO TAKE DRIVIN' ACTION AT ONCE

BERLIN, Dec. 5.—The minister of education has issued a new decree against "dime novels" and "trashy literature." He says that the danger to the German youth from this source of "mental poison" is increasing. He urges parents not only to supervise and watch over the class of novels and romantic reading indulged in by children, but also recommends the withdrawal from books of daily papers and weekly or monthly publications which tend to blunt the moral sensibilities of the youth.

the residents of the city should rejoice. Public parks are only one of the many phases of community progress in which the interests of county and city are mutual, and there seems no reason why prejudice should be appealed to on either side of this discussion.

The writer is one who did not so vote, nor was the question then at issue. Furthermore, the county judge is not merely the official of those who by their votes elected him, but the official of the whole population of the county, and in discharging duties of his office should set upon the consideration of what is legal, right and best.
Commercialism is not only the thing the promotion of which should engage the attention of a progressive and patriotic people. To curb the expansion of that principle in the interest of altruistic and benevolent sentiments is worthy of the thought and labor of all good people. It is to be regretted, since an expression of the sentiments of the voters was sought, that it was not proposed on the ballot at the regular election, so that the result could have been regarded as official.
