## ENTERTAINMENT WELL PLANNED

**THE HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL PLAYERS WILL CANVAS THE CITY IN ORDER TO SELL TICKETS TO THE RECITAL**

Tickets have been placed on sale for the Preston recital, which is to take place on Friday, December 19th, at the White Pelican, and there has been considerable demand for them already. The town has been divided into five districts, and each district has been assigned to one of the basketball team, for whom the recital is given. These boys will have charge of the selling campaign that is to be carried out in the next few days. The proceeds will go toward defraying the team's expenses in the trip they plan to take during the holidays.

The entertainment will be a "cello recital by Mr. F. P. Search, accompanied by the piano. As to the merit of the recital, the Chicago Music News says in a critical estimate:

## ELECTRIC CHAIR FOR NOOSE, PLAN

**EX-SPEAKER OF HOUSE C. N. McARTHUR WILL INTRODUCE A BILL IN THE LEGISLATURE TO DO AWAY WITH SCAFFOLD**

Substitution of the electric chair for the rope in the death chamber at the state penitentiary will be proposed in a bill being prepared for introduction in the coming session of the legislature by ex-Speaker C. N. McArthur.

"The electric chair provides a much more humane way of putting men out of the world," says Mr. McArthur. "It can be installed with little expense, and requires only a slight change in one section of the code."

The former speaker has been collecting data on the subject, and will have a bill ready for introduction early in the session. He is also preparing a series of bills to repeal the "dead wood" in the statute books. He says there are forty or fifty pages of "law" in the books that is not law at all, having been superseded by later statutes or by constitutional provisions. For instance, one law provides for the inauguration of the governor in October, but for years the constitution has made the term of the new governor begin in January. Numerous bills will be required to repeal the old statutes, as they embrace many subjects and cannot be included in one act. Their adoption will clear the law books of confusing and out of date sections, and reduce the printing when the code is again revised.
