### REMINISCENCE

By C. B. Watson, pioneer of Klamath Co., now of Ashland

I feel reminiscent. Perhaps nobody cares, and I don't care whether they do or not. After many years I am on the ground of former experiences, and delight in looking backward. The tragedy of Lot's wife does not deter me. Pillar of salt! Why not salt as well as adulterated dirt? But reminiscence leads me to philosophy, and I must not philosophize.

Forty years ago last June I crossed Link River at the site of the present bridge, but not over that bridge. 'Presto! I see it all now. I wipe out the present. Klamath Falls is not here. It is "Linkville," and Linkville is "Uncle George" Nurse. I see him now, tobacco stains and all. He was a great man, was Uncle George, tobacco and all. But I'm not to write his biography, nor anybody's biography.

Forty years ago—pole bridge, board shanty, called "lavern," little shack on the point of rocks, called "store"; blacksmith shop, where the horses were shod and ramshackle wagons toggled up; one shanty where people lived aside from the tavern; a shed where hay (wild hay) was stored, and jaded horses fed; then rocks, and toads, and snakes, and sage brush. Sage, sage, sage brush everywhere—miles and miles of it—and alkali dust and "injuns"—and the Applegates and Shooks and a few other "first families."

That was Linkville and the Klamath country forty years ago. Between here and Alkali Valley was only sage brush, alkali, jack rabbits, coyotes and "injuns." Between Alkali Valley and Yalmaz, ditto, and so on to Goose Lake. A few hardy pioneers had invaded Goose Lake Valley; a garrison of soldiers was stationed on the mountains bordering Warner Valley and a few stockmen in that valley. From Warner to Stains mountain were only coyotes, jack rabbits, antelopes (thousands of them), and occasionally a mountain sheep—plenty of them, perhaps, but they managed to keep out of sight, as a rule, and everywhere was sage, sage, and the smell of it. Bunch grass there was in abundance—Indians, too, but they kept out of sight, for the great Modoc war was brewing, and broke a few months later. On and on and on we wandered. To the Owyhee, across Whiskey Hills, swam Snake River, and, like Columbus, on over the great plains, where are now cities and towns, and fields made great by the push and vigor that has carried water to the desert and made it blossom like the rose.

I sit here now, on that point of brick and stone, and hammer out

### FAULDER'S LIFE MAY BE SAVED

RUMORS ARE CURRENT THAT THE GOVERNOR WILL COMMUTE DEATH SENTENCE OF KLAMATH COUNTY MAN

In spite of repeated denials by the governor, rumors that Noble Faulder may yet escape the gallows next Friday morning, the time set for him to be hanged, continue to drift to this city from Salem. A few days ago newspaper men attempted to secure an interview with Faulder, but he declined to talk to them.

It is reported that Governor West will commute Faulder's sentence to life imprisonment. The governor has communicated with Judge Benson, who presided at the trial of Faulder, but the court declined to make any recommendations.

Faulder is a native of New Zealand, where his relatives now reside. They are reported to be wealthy. When a boy Faulder came to the United States and followed railroad work. He was employed on the Natron cut-off when he killed the cook in the camp in which he was working. Because of the fact that Faulder threatened to fire a second shot at his victim, then almost breathing his last, the crime was considered more cold-blooded.

An effort is being made to have the case against John W. Taylor reviewed. He is due to walk on the gallows with Faulder. Taylor is said to be the victim of an incompetent attorney.
