

OREGON PIONEER PASSES AWAY

JACOB KAMM, STEAMBOAT AND RAILROAD MAN, DIED AT THE AGE OF 80—HE WAS A MIL-
LIONAIRE

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 14.—Jacob Kamm, aged 80 years, died at 7:30 this morning. His wife was in attendance.

Mr. Kamm was a millionaire. He came to Oregon in 1880, and started the Oregon Steam Navigation company. He operated the first steamboat on the Columbia, and prospected in different parts of the Northwest. In 1880 the Steam Navigation company was taken over by the O. R. & N. Mr. Kamm started the Celilo portage, the first railroad in the state.

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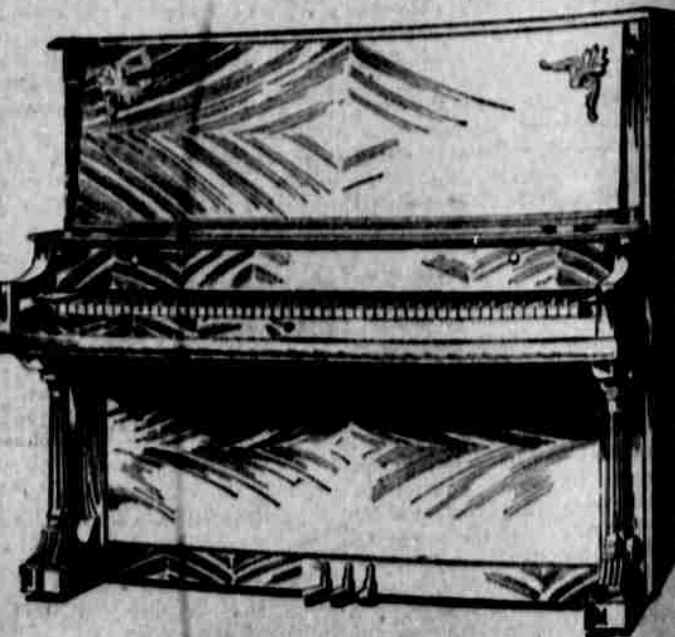
