WEATHER STOPS DITCH DIGGING

NEVERN STORM IN POE VALLEY PUTS STOP TO WORK ON THE SECOND UNIT LATERAL OF THE RECLAMATION SERVICE
 Work on the North and South Poe Valley laterals of the second unit has been suspended for a few days, according to word received by the local officials of the reclamation service. The men are remaining in camp, and if the storm clears off work will be continued again.
 The storm was severe in Poe Valley, it is stated, and the ground, in addition to being covered with snow, is frozen. This interfered with the making of proper embankments.
 Instead of having only 10 per cent completed, as the contract stipulates, the sub-contractors working under Maney Brothers have finished 40 per cent of the excavation work, so they can discontinue work for the winter whenever they see fit.
 Work on the Oregon lateral has been continued, the storm not interfering to any extent.

WOMAN TELLS OF DYNAMITE PLOT

TELEPHONES TO PRIVATE DETECTIVE AGENCY THAT FEDERAL BUILDING IN INDIANAPOLIS IS TO BE BLOWN UP
 INDIANAPOLIS, Dec. 18.—A sensation was sprung during the hearing of the dynamite cases in the federal court this morning when a woman telephoned to a private detective agency, giving warning of a plot to blow up the federal building. The defendants denied the story. Nevertheless the guard about the building has been increased.
 Special Assistant United States Attorney Noel opened the argument for the government. He declared that the testimony of the defendant had been "lies and explanations that did not explain." He charged perjury, and said that the defense was afraid to call Hockin and others to the stand.
 The argument for the government will last four days.
