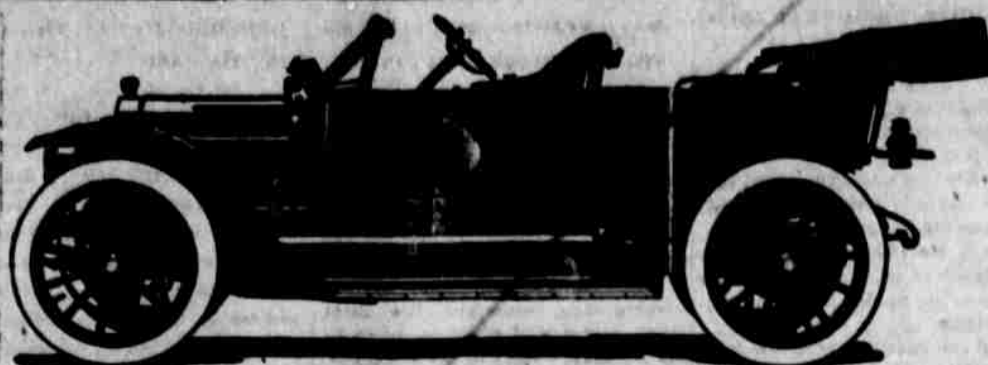

REED WANTS TO GET DAMAGES

SUES POSTMASTER BRANDENBURG FOR \$2,500 BECAUSE OF LOSS SUSTAINED BY NOT MARKETING PRODUCE

Trial of the suit to recover damages on an injunction bond was commenced in the circuit court this morning by J. B. Reed, the defendant being Postmaster Clyde K. Brandenburg as principal and Marion Hanks and G. Heitkemper Jr., as sureties. E. L. Elliott and C. C. Brower are attorneys for Reed, and John Irwin is conducting the defense.

The jury selected is composed of Alex Cheyne Jr., M. F. Orr, Frank Choipening, John Hagelstein, Charles Thomas, E. R. C. Williams, Frank L. Applegate, Frank Downey, Ellis Young, Albert Johns, H. A. Talbot and Charles Loomis. The selection of the jury was made in good time, and

the opening argument had started before court adjourned at noon.

The cause of the action being tried dates back to 1909. On October 8 of that year Brandenburg secured a temporary injunction, restraining Reed from marketing hay, grain, potatoes and other produce from the Burk Farm, one mile east of Bonanza, or from going on the place, or renting it. Hanks and Heitkemper signed the bond for the undertaking with Brandenburg in the sum of \$1,000 each.

Some time after this, according to the plaintiff, the injunction was dismissed at the cost of Brandenburg. The delay before the injunction was removed, he states, interfered with the marketing of the produce, a great deal of the vegetables spoiled, and he was injured to the extent of \$2,500. His action is brought to recover this amount.
