WALTON WILL REMAIN IN CITY

RESIGNATION OF MANAGER OF POWER COMPANY IS NOT ACCEPTED, AND FINALLY HE IS PERSUADED TO CHANGE PLANS

Instead of entering the insurance business in Marshfield, George J. Walton is to remain here as manager of the Klamath division of the California-Oregon Power company. This was announced this morning.

Mr. Walton tendered his resignation to the company some time ago, but the officials refused to accept it. Walton was determined to leave, however, and wrote a second resignation, but this called forth a constant stream of letters and telegrams from the officers of the company, until he has Friday persuaded to change his plans and remain with the company.

REED FAILS IN HIS LAW SUIT

JUDGE BENSON GRANTS MOTION FOR NON-SUIT IN THE CASE IN WHICH POSTMASTER BRANDENBURG WAS DEFENDANT

The suit of J. B. Reed against Clyde K. Brandenburg et al was dismissed today, following the granting of a non-suit upon motion of John Irwin, Brandenburg's attorney. The motion for a non-suit was based upon the ground that the plaintiff had failed to prove a cause of action sufficient to submit to the jury.

The motion was made last night by Mr. Irwin, and arguments were made by himself and by Attorneys Elliott and Brower for the plaintiff. Judge Benson rendered his opinion this morning.

The suit was brought against Mr. Brandenburg as principal and Marion Hanks and G. Heitkemper Jr. as sureties to recover damages on a bond for undertaking.

Parcels Post is to Be Effective in Few Days

Regulations are Sifted Down to Eleven Simple Rules. Live Animals Cannot be Sent by the Post

The parcels post act becomes effective January 1st, and preparations are already under way in the local postoffice to take care of the business. Although it is expected that there will be considerable additional work, no arrangements have been made for the employment of extra help, and it is not expected that any will be authorized for some time.

The rules and regulations under which the act will be carried out have been screened down to eleven rules, which follow:

- 1—Parcels cannot be mailed in package boxes; must be brought to the postoffice or designated postal station.
- 2—Rates of postage for packages weighing not more than four ounces are the same as at present. Packages weighing more than four ounces take new post pound rates, which are arranged according to distance carried.
- 3—Distinctive parcel post stamps must be used, and packages mailed with ordinary postage stamps will be treated as unmailable. The parcel post stamps will not be good for postage on other classes of mail matter.
- 4—Sender's name and address must appear on all packages. Postmasters are directed to treat as unmailable parcels presented for mailing on which this information is not clearly shown.
- 5—Seeds, cuttings, bulbs, scions, plants, etc., are mailable only at the rate of one cent for each two ounces.

- 6—Printed matter, books, etc., are not mailable under new parcel post regulations, but must go as third class matter at present rate of one cent for each two ounces or fraction, without regard to distance. Parcel post stamps are not good for postage on this class of matter.
- 7—Unmailable: Live animals, live poultry, spirituous, vinous and malt liquors, explosives, articles liable to injure the mails or persons handling same.
- 8—Liquids other than those shown in paragraph 7 are unmailable only when it is unnecessary to transport them over steam or electric railways. Liquids may be sent to any destination when mailed in glass bottles containing not more than 12 ounces, such bottles to be encased in a block or tube surrounded with sufficient absorbent material to take up the contents of the bottle if broken.
- 9—Insured: Parcels may be insured up to \$50 in value for a fee of 10 cents.
- 10—Registry abolished: It will not be possible to register merchandise parcels under the new regulations, the insured mail taking place of the registry system as applied to fourth class matter.
- 11—Wrapping: All parcels must be securely wrapped and sufficiently well packed to protect contents from damage in transit.

County School Superintendent J. G. Swan this morning sent to Salem the papers submitted by the teachers who took the examinations for state certificates this week. The papers will be graded at the office of the superintendent of public instruction.
