# CHICAGO POLICE ACT RAPIDLY

### FOUR SUSPECTS ARE HELD FOR THE MURDER OF DIAMOND MERCHANT—REVENGE IS BELIEVED THE MOTIVE

CHICAGO, Dec. 21.—Clyde Stratton, an ex-convict, Margaret Johnson and Edward Hampden and wife were examined by the police today. They are suspected of having been involved in the murder of J. P. Logue, the diamond merchant.

Stratton was seen in front of Logue's office near the time of the murder. Two blonde women, corresponding in description to the women in custody, were also seen near the office.

Revenge is believed to have been the motive for the crime.
