CONVICT WORKS AS A SURVEYOR

SUPERINTENDENT LAWSON MAKES USE OF TALENTS OF TALENTED SLAYER OF JEWELER—SURVEYS PRISON LAND

SALEM, Dec. 23.—The previous training of present inmates of the penitentiary is being put to good use by Colonel Lawson. Edward H. Martin, who was sent to the state prison for the slaying of Nathan Wolf, a jeweler, is assisting the superintendent in surveying the penitentiary grounds. Colonel Lawson is himself a civil engineer, and the two have been taking measurements of the grounds for some time past.
That Martin may be considered for parole when the board meets next month is persistently rumored around the capitol. The matter of granting this man a parole came up several months ago, but at this time it was alleged that Martin showed symptoms of having been under the influence of drugs, and the authorities suspected him of having obtained cocaine or morphine from some outside source, and on this account the question of granting him a parole was indefinitely postponed.

WEEKLY SERMON

A Christmas Sermon

By Rev. Dr. Henry C. Collins, Rector of the Rectory

When our Lord first came, expecting something for themselves, great multitudes flocked to Him. When He told them that to be His they must deny self and take up His cross to follow Him, they promptly cleared out. Only the apostles were left, and they had cut the bond between them and their past, and could not return; and they said: "We've left all. What shall we find?" He said, persecutions.
Now what is the matter with Christians today? Why, just the same denial, they do not want any persecution; no giving up for His cause. If it is not going to benefit them, add something to their material benefit, they do not want it. The world outside does not want it because it does not promise them riches and good things. If the church would give bread by blessing a few loaves and fishes, they'd be flocking to it as they, when it says except a man deny himself and take up the Lord's cross, why they say: "Good bye: I'll continue in the old world way. I'll eat, drink and be merry this Christmas."
Text—"When the Son of Man shall come in His glory then what will you do?"
Now it was to prepare for that day that Christ started a corporation called not the church. This church is not an end in itself. It was incorporated by God to do a certain work. Its articles of incorporation are recorded in Heaven.
It was to prepare for that day of trial. The sinner is to appear before the bar of God and his life examined just as the offender against the law, social or criminal, before the court; and it is to prepare men for that so that they may not come up before that bar without attorney and their cases prepared. What is to be the plea? Ignorance? Foolishness?
The most arrant fraud knows he is not doing what his own conscience tells him when a man says he's living the best he knows, doing the best he can. No, you cannot plead ignorance.
Note what is required of man. The may says why join the church? Well, this is why: God sent His Son to organize a body to help men to transform men, to teach them the kind of life to live. He gave them a personal example. Now, He gave that body one order: "Go, make disciples of all nations, baptizing them." Admitting all who want to be God's. Christ's followers—to help in His work. It is a recruiting station like the government's here for soldiers. They are to do the work and when they want to

enlist they are admitted. It does not ask, have they been sinners, murderers or saints. They enter not because they are good, but because they want to help in doing this work. They have to take the oath of allegiance to the Lord, as a soldier of the government has. But, friend, how many real patriots are in any army? Few. Most are mercenaries. How many real Christians for Christ, for His name's sake? Well, why are you outsiders growling about the mercenaries in the church? We do not profess to have all followers of Him. They belong to a worldly band, and are just like you men of the devil's army, but with this difference: They are lined up with His cause, and that is a big thing. The army of Uncle Sam would be weak without the mercenaries. So would the church. And then the church is to drill and train them to make soldiers of them. Note this: All enlist for the service, not to save their lives, but to risk their lives. Do not enter the church to save your life, but to give it.
Now you will see what the church is. It is an organization to do work, redeem the world, prepare every man for the great parade when the King, Son of Man, shall come in His glory to review the army. As they pass the review stand that great day they will be separated as the sheep from the goats, two lines, one turning as they march up to the right and one to the left.
The great conquest is accomplished, the kingdom is won. Then shall the Son say to those on the right hand: "Come, ye blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you."
It is won, for I was hungry and you gave Me meat.
Then shall they say: "When, Lord?"
When you did it into the heart of these My—your—brethren, men of the world.
The church is to work. It is to call men to the Christ life. It enlists men to conquer the world by drawing men of all nations into His service. Are you registered, enlisted? If so, "Blessed are ye." Are you doing more, are you seeking to win men to Christ?—the only happy life is His service. Then you shall hear Him say in the great review: "Come, ye blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."
If Christ came Christmas, would you be ready?
