PLAN ROAD INTO LAKE COUNTY

HILL ROAD MAY BE EXTENDED FROM BEND TO LAKEVIEW, WHERE CONNECTION WILL BE MADE WITH WESTERN PACIFIC

The latest report to reach this city regarding railroad extension in Central Oregon is that the Hill road will be built south from Bend to Lakeview where connection will be made with the Nevada, California and Oregon road, which connects with the Western Pacific at Doyle, Nevada.

A telegram from San Francisco is as follows:

To effect a combination of interests by which the Hill lines may reach San Francisco and the Western Pacific railroad tap Portland, is the reason assigned today for the presence here of Joseph H. Young, president of the Hill lines in Oregon, and the Spokane, Portland and Seattle railroad. The plan is said to involve the joint acquisition of the Nevada, California and Oregon road, which connects with the Western Pacific at Doyle, Nevada, connecting it with the Oregon Trunk now operating to Bend, in Central Oregon.

J. C. Cleghorn and wife, who are spending their honeymoon in the groom's former home, Onawa, Iowa, will return to Klamath Falls some time next week, according to information received by the bride's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles H. Withrow. Mr. Cleghorn is assistant engineer at the local headquarters of the reclamation service.

Viceroy of India is Recovering From Murderous Attack



Lord Hardinge, viceroy of India, who narrowly escaped fatal injury at the hands of a would-be assassin, at Delhi, India. The bomb, which was thrown from a housetop as the viceroy with Lady Hardinge was riding past in the howdah on the back of an elephant, was loaded with scrap iron, nuts, nails and bolts. Several of the nails were driven into the viceroy's back by the force of the explosion, but have been extracted, and it is expected that he will be able to resume his duties in a short time. Lady Hardinge, who suffered severely from the shock, is the constant attendant of her husband.

WAS STAUFFER CLARK'S PARTNER

IMPORTANT QUESTION IS INVOLVED IN LAW SUIT BEFORE JUDGE MCGINN—BRIEFS ARE NOW BEING PREPARED

Arguments to show that a partnership had existed between George C. Clark, who constructed the Lost River diversion dam for the government, and Dr. J. E. Stauffer of Everett, Wash., who furnished Clark money to commence work on the dam, were submitted in the circuit court this morning prior to the selecting of a jury to try the action of A. G. Lewis against Clark and Stauffer to recover money.

Attorney W. H. Shaw for the plaintiff read a deposition from Stauffer to substantiate the claim that a partnership exists, and documents to the contrary were submitted by Harold C. Merryman, Clark's attorney. Before the forenoon session closed Judge McGinn instructed the attorneys to submit briefs supporting their contentions, and these are being prepared.

Lewis is proprietor of the Monarch Grocery of this city. He claims that Clark and Stauffer as his partner are indebted to him for groceries furnished the boarding house at the diversion dam during the course of construction.
