LAW MAKING IS IN PROGRESS

CALIFORNIA LEGISLATURE GETS INTO ACTION WITH THE PROGRESSIVES IN COMPLETE CONTROL OF MACHINERY

SACRAMENTO, Cal., Jan. 6.—At 12 o'clock today, gavel rapped in Senate and Assembly and the fortieth California state legislature was in regular session. Probably never in the history of the state have conditions been so peculiar, for the legislature is dominated by Progressives elected on the regular Republican ticket. The Progressive majority in the Senate is overwhelming; in the Assembly it is less certain, the Democrats 35 members, the "Taft" Republicans 19, Socialists and the Progressives 44, with a few Progressives wavering between maintaining their allegiance to the Republican party and casting their lot with the avowed Progressives.

The Senate was called to order by Lieutenant Governor Wallace who announced that the old officers of the Senate were present and would continue to officiate, under statute until new ones had been chosen. He called for prayer and the matter of administering the oath of the new members was taken up. The roll of the holdover Senators was first called and then that of the Senators-elect.

The formation of the temporary organization was taken up, among these duties being the election of a president pro tem and committees were appointed to notify the assembly that the Senate was ready for the transaction of business and the governor that the Senate would receive his message.

In the meantime, in the assembly, L. B. McMillory, clerk of the pro-

ceeding session, had called the members to order. His first announcement that the requisite officers of the last Assembly were present and he then called for prayer. After the prayer, Mallory made several temporary appointments and proceeded to call the roll alphabetically, themselves being sworn in by a judicial officer.

Governor Johnson, in his message, declared that the most serious immediate problem lies in provisions for ample revenue for the next biennial period. Humanitarian measures were favored, the enactment of a "blue sky" law urged as well as an administrative commission which would have the same general supervision over state constitutions as is now exercised by the board of control over the state's fiscal affairs.

C. O. Young of Berkeley will be speaker of the assembly. W. A. Sutherland of Fresno, Stanley Benedict of Los Angeles and L. D. Bennett of San Jose agreed early today to withdraw in favor of Young for the sake of harmony in the ranks of the progressives.

License Refused

TRESPASSING IS CAUSE OF INJURY

SOUTHERN PACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY ISSUES STATEMENT SHOWING HOW SO MANY PEOPLE ARE INJURED EACH YEAR

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 6.—"Trespassing on the railroad right-of-way is the greatest cause for railroad fatalities," according to the investigations of the Safety Committees on the ten divisions of the Southern Pacific. It has been found that more than fifty per cent of the accidents that occur on this road happen to trespassers.

The Safety Committees on the Southern Pacific were organized last June and since that time every accident of any description has been investigated by the committees and a remedy suggested to prevent a repetition.

Each of the ten divisions of the Southern Pacific has a safety committee that meets once a month to discuss the accidents of the past thirty days. A majority of these accidents are minor, such as smashed fingers and bruised limbs. "Safety First" is the watchword and the particular object of the meetings is to discuss methods of preventing such accidents.

We believe that itemized accounts of expenditures and all recommended changes in plans, specifications and estimated changes of cost made during the construction of any Government irrigation project should be monthly transmitted to the project water users association.

We believe that the project Water Users Association should be permitted to undertake the construction of a project under Act of June 17, 1902, at the estimated cost when bids are not obtained for such construction at less than the estimated cost.

We believe that homestead settlers on public lands within any Government irrigation project should receive irrigation water on a maintenance base for a period of three years before commencement of payment of construction charges.

We believe that the project Water Users Association should be permitted to take complete control of the maintenance and use of a project or feasible unit immediately upon completion of same.

We believe that none of the resources acquired in conjunction with any project should be sold, leased or otherwise disposed of, except by approval of the project Water Users Association.

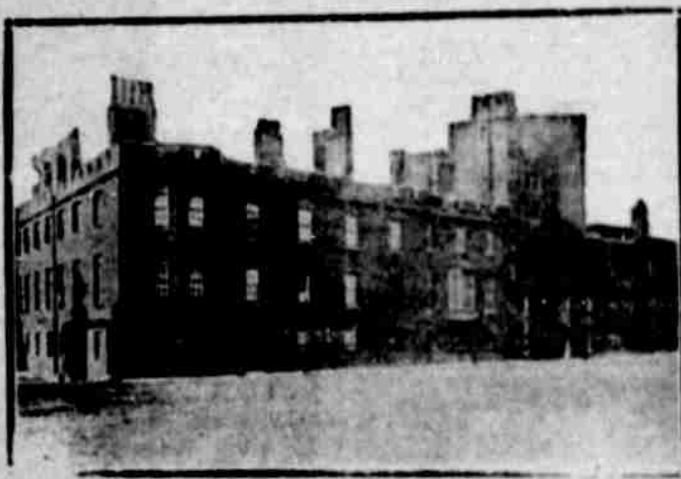
We believe that provision should be made for extension of time for payment of construction charges during exceptionally needy conditions of individual water users.
