Daughter of British Premier to Visit in Washington



Miss Violet Asquith, eldest daughter of the prime minister of England, who arrived in New York recently with the Countess of Aberdeen, is to be the guest of Ambassador and Mrs. George Bryce in Washington. Miss Asquith has a keen interest in woman suffrage, but she is unable to take an active part in the propaganda because of her father's public position. Since the death last year of her fiancé, the Hon. Archie Gordon, third son of the Countess of Aberdeen, Miss Asquith has devoted herself to serious philanthropic work, and has established in London a school where boys from the slums may learn trades. When William Watson wrote the poem "The Woman With The Serpent's Tongue" Miss Asquith was mentioned as being the target of the poet's bitter barbs. Miss Asquith declared that Watson was caricatured because her father refused to recommend him for a literary position and for knighthood.

As Stranded Liner Appeared on Shoals North of Atlanta City



The United Fruit steamship Terralba, which went ashore on Brigantine Shoals, north of Atlantic City, on December 24, has been towed to New York City for repairs. In addition to the rudder and stern frame being carried away, and the blades of the propeller broken off the port screw, the ship shows many signs of damage. Several of the port lights were broken by the smashing blows of the huge waves. There were fifty-seven passengers aboard the Terralba, who were obliged to hold their Christmas festivities on the crippled liner.
