LONDON, Jan. 2.—That the suffragettes are plotting to kidnap some member of the British Cabinet was learned here today following the announcement that Scotland Yard was in possession of reliable information bearing on the plan.

BAKERS NOT TO WORK NIGHTS

INQUIRY SHOWS THAT HEALTH OF BREAD MAKERS WHO WORK AFTER DARK IS POOR. CONSUMPTION PREVALENT.

BARCELONA, Jan. 2.—As the request of the Federation of Operative Bakers, which has set itself actively to the task of stopping night work in the bakery trades, the Institute of Social Reform has been inquiring into the condition of the industry and the effect of night work on the health of the workers. The result of the inquiry shows that in the worst cases where the bake houses are unhealthy and the working hours unduly long, forty per cent of the workers are afflicted with consumption.
