COAST WILL GET UNDESIRABLES

TECHNICAL POINT DECIDES A SUIT

FAILURE OF DWIGHT LUMBER CO. TO TAKE LEGAL STEPS TO DO BUSINESS IN STATE CAUSES LOSS

Upon the ground that the Dwight Lumber Company, a corporation transacted business in this state without filing their declaration with the secretary of state or paying their registration fee, Judge McGinn today rendered a verdict in favor of the Long Lake Lumber Company, defendants in the action which the Dwight Lumber Company commenced against the Long Lake company for \$5,000 commission fee, alleged to be due for selling the output of the Long Lake Mill to the California Fruit Canners Association. The suit came up for trial this morning.

Following the selection of a jury, the defense through J. C. Rotundo set up the claim that the Dwight firm had no right to operate in this state as it is an outside corporation, and pays no license fee here. This was admitted by C. M. O'Neill for the plaintiff, but he held that the company did not operate in this state.

The question of whether or not the company has operated in this state was submitted to the jury by Judge McGinn. So after luncheon, they quickly arrived at a verdict favoring the defendant's contention. A judgment for the defense was then rendered by Judge McGinn.

The jury selected in the case was composed of Thomas A. Barrows, Jr., Charles Thomas, Ed DuPaul, Frank L. Applegate, R. E. C. Williams, R. A. Mummitt, Frank Corpening, I. J. Straw, M. P. Orr, Charles Loomis, S. T. Summers, R. W. Willerson.

without celebration. During July, August and September, it is estimated sufficient water will flow into the lake reservoirs at the Gatun and Miraflores locks to enable passage of the first vessel—a Panama railroad ship—through the entire canal on October 5, the 40th anniversary of the discovery of the Pacific by Balboa. The canal will not be thrown open to the commerce of the world until after the dedication on January 1, 1915.

TAXPAYERS OF BONANZA WILL PAY A TWO MILL CITY TAX AND A ONE MILL SCHOOL TAX. MERRILL NO. 1 MILL.

Last year, the tax payers of this city were assessed \$6.3 mills, divided as follows: County general levy, 11.3 mills; city levy, 9 mills; school levy 3 mills.

In addition to the county levy of 16.5, taxpayers of Bonanza will pay a two mill city tax and one mill school tax. This makes a total assessment of 19.5 mills.

The city tax at Merrill is 10 mills, and the school levy is 11 mills. This makes the total assessment for property owners in that city \$7.6 mills.

In all other parts of the county, the county general levy will be 24.5 mills, on account of the road fund assessment, which is not levied against property within the limits of an incorporated city.
