## NEW HORSEFLY MAP IS FILED

HIGH LANDS IN NORTHERN PART OF THE DISTRICT ARE EXCLUDED AND ADDITIONAL TERRITORY IS TAKEN IN

A change has been made in the boundary of the Horsefly Irrigation District, by order of the board of directors of the district, and a map showing the alteration, was filed at the clerk's office today, with a description, by Kuykendall & Ferguson, attorneys for the district.

The change was made in order to exclude lands in the extreme northwestern part of the district that were found to be too high to be reached by the irrigation ditches of the district. By taking in additional acreage at the southwestern corner the district still remains in the neighborhood of 19,000 acres.

## VOTED; MAY LOSE LAND ALLOTMENTS

CASTING BALLOTS FOR WET AND DRY FACTIONS MAY PROVE COSTLY TO YAKIMA RESIDENTS OF INDIAN LINEAGE

NORTH YAKIMA, Wash., Jan. 10.—Because certain residents of the city, with Indian blood in them, were induced to vote on the "wet" and "dry" question at the recent election, they stand in danger, it is claimed, of losing valuable land allotments. There are a large number of white men who have married Indian women, and their children have been duly recognized as wards of the government, entitled to share in the allotment of Indian lands. By exercising the rights of American citizens, however, it is claimed they have forfeited their rights as wards. Government officials, it is said, have been called upon to investigate and define the legal status in the matter.

## FIRE DEPARTMENT IS QUARANTINED

CHIEF AND TWELVE FIREMEN AT ABERDEEN ARE CONFINED TO WORKING QUARTERS ON ACCOUNT OF CHICKENPOX

ABERDEEN, Wash., Jan. 10.—Fire Chief William Tamblin and 12 members of the Aberdeen fire department are confined to their working quarters, quarantined there on account of chickenpox. Two of the men are down with the infection, and Dr. L. L. Goodnow, the health officer, decided to quarantine the whole force. Although the men are not allowed to leave their quarters for any other purpose, they are not prevented from going to work, and so have almost daily exercise in the fresh air, as fire alarms are frequent.

MEDFORD, Jan. 10.—The total valuation of Jackson county for 1912 will be between \$27,500,000 and \$28,000,000, depending on what the corporation valuations are to be made by the state. The valuation will be a little less than in 1911.

## FEEDING QUAIL DURING SNOW

GAME WARDENS AND CITIZENS ARE THROWING WHEAT TO BIRDS UNABLE TO FEED DURING STORM

The heavy fall of snow during the past few days has deprived the flocks of quail their chances to feed, and for several days it will be necessary to scatter wheat for them. This work has already been commenced by Deputy District Game Warden Carey M. Ramsby and Deputy Game Warden Henry Stout, and they have made arrangements for the feeding of flocks with farmers in different parts of the county.  
"The quail are unusually plentiful this year," said Mr. Ramsby today, "and at the Shook ranch on Lost River a thousand birds at least are being fed wheat by the Shook boys. We have located and fed several large flocks, and will furnish wheat for the feeding of any flocks reported to us."  
Quite a number of quail made their appearance on Conger avenue this morning, and they were fed by D. V. Kuykendall, R. M. Richardson and other residents.

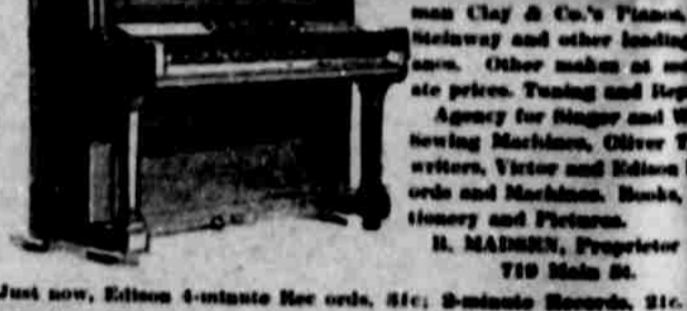
