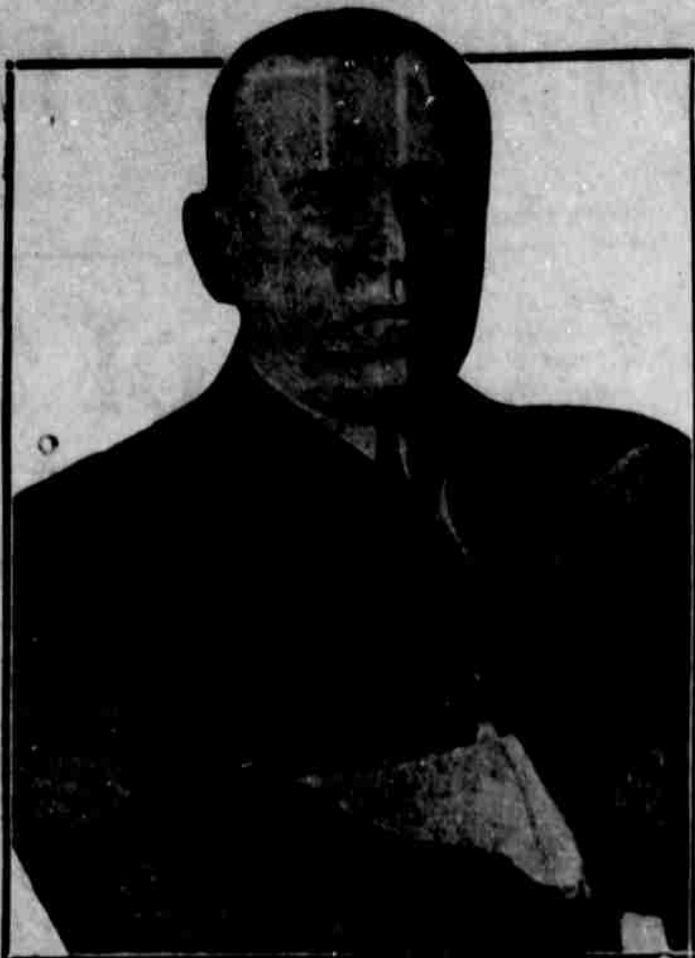

NO SCOTCH RYE BY PARCEL POST

POSTAL OFFICIALS AT PORTLAND BECAME SUSPICIOUS OF ODOR FROM PACKAGE, AND IT IS CONFISCATED
