If a measure now pending in congress for the giving of a tract of government land on the edge of the city to Klamath Falls for park purposes is passed, this city will have two park locations.

Recent reports from Washington indicate that the measure will pass, as there has as yet developed no opposition to it.

The land which it is proposed to turn over to the city is located on the east side of Lake Kwauna, and is about 140 acres in extent. It is claimed that with very little expense it could be made into a park.
