Rear Admiral Charles J. Badger,
who succeeded Rear Admiral Hugo
Detachment as commander in chief of
the Atlantic Fleet, is in charge of a
fleet twice as powerful as the en-
tire United States navy at the time of
the Spanish war. Rear Admiral Badger
was aid for inspections in the
navy department before his promo-
tion. He is the son of the late Com-
modore Oscar C. Badger, and entered
the naval academy in 1869, being an
appointee of President Grant. In the
war with Spain he served on the cru-
iser Cincinnati. He also participated in
the Greeley relief expedition to the
Arctic, and is both an ex-superintend-
ent and ex-commandant of midship-
men at Annapolis.

COUNTY COURTS**

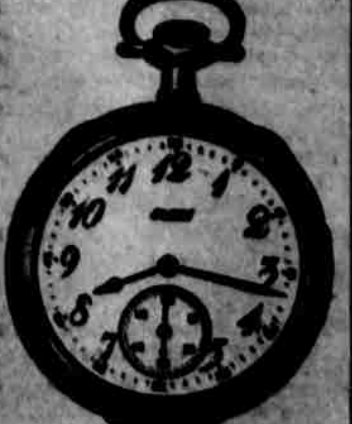
SALEM, Jan. 16.—Declaring that
