VESSEL GIVEN UP AS WRECKED

LONDON INSURANCE OFFICE NOTIFIED THAT HOPE FOR THE SAFETY OF MISSING STEAMER HAS BEEN ABANDONED

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 17.—Officials of the company today notified Lloyds of London that all hope for the safety of the steamer Eldorado, missing several days, has been abandoned. It is believed that the boat went to the bottom and that the 41 persons aboard perished.

The Eldorado was on the run from Galveston to New York. She was making the southward trip when she disappeared completely.
