D. M. McLEMORE ON MULES

D. M. McLemore is of the opinion
that mules may be profitably raised in
the Klamath country. To the farm
expert of The Herald the famous
stockman made this disclosure this
morning.

"The mule does not attain matur-
ity as soon as a horse," said Mr. Mc-
Lemore, "and handle its pedal ex-
tremities in a much more scientific
manner and for a longer period of
time than a horse.

"As a beast of burden it is much
more preferable to the horse. I would
compare a mule to a goat, except that
a mule butts in backward. Also there
is some prejudice to mule meat, while
some people regard a choice cut from
a goat as a delicacy.

"The mule is sure footed. So is a
goat. But the goat is also 'sure horned.'
In this respect the mule has it
over the goat because it is able to
kick either separately or in unison
with its hind feet, while a goat has to
hook out with both horns at the
same time.

"As a means of support the mule is
all right ordinarily, but with the
orange crop of California a complete
failure, and the notable aversion of
the rest of the California crop, the
tourists, to the mule I would advise
Klamath farmers at this time to spend
their time and energy in raising
goats."

**STUDENTS AT STATE INSTITU-
TION EXCHANGE MESSAGES
WITH ISLANDS OF THE PACIFIC

CORVALLIS, Jan. 18.—Wireless
messages from Honolulu, San Diego,
San Francisco and from various Pa-
cific islands and steamships were
picked up last night by Joe Malloch
and C. H. Watson, two Portland stu-
dents in the college of engineering,
at the Oregon Agricultural college,
on a large aerial strung from the
clock tower of the administration
building to the foundry chimney.

The wireless system was installed
by the students as a part of the en-
tertaining and instructive displays to
be made Friday and Saturday night
at the annual engineering show,
which grew out of the electrical dis-
plays which for the successive years
proved so popular with students and
large crowds of visitors.
