ELEVEN MILLION JEWS IN WORLD

NEW YORK HAS LARGEST BREW POPULATION OF ANY CITY IN THE WORLD—HALF OF RACE RESIDES IN RUSSIA

BERLIN, Jan. 20.—According to statistics published here, there are 11,871,783 Jews, of which 8,942,264 live in Europe; 1,894,409 in America, 522,625 in Asia, 841,897 in Africa, and 17,996 scattered. Of the number in Europe 5,110,548, or almost one-half in the world, are in Russia. With 1,062,000, New York has the largest Jewish population of any city in the world, Warsaw coming next, with 254,712, Vienna, 146,526, London 144,300, and Berlin 93,592.

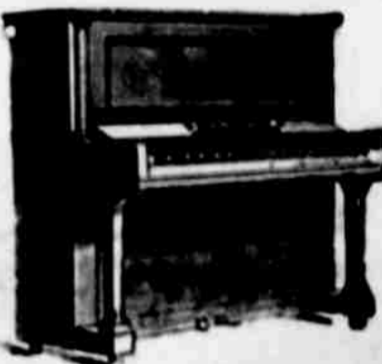

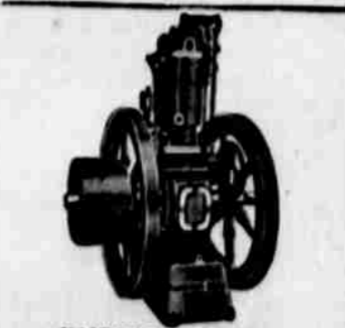
