Francis Josef, the venerable ruler of Austria, who has been the victim of sleeping spells for many years, is again suffering from this complaint. The emperor was 82 years of age last August, and his physicians express some doubt as to his ability to rally from his recent attack. It is said that Archduke Francis Ferdinand takes advantage of the emperor's absence from court to practice "king-making" and that he will declare a radical war policy as soon as he is in power.

Why Counterfeiters Cannot Sleep



William J. Flynn, the new chief of the United States secret service, is rapidly destroying the prospects of the young men who have taken up counterfeiting as a profession. Mr. Flynn, who succeeds John E. Wilkie, now chief of the customs service, has been one of the government's sleuths for a great many years, and was promoted to his present position from that of chief of the local bureau in New York. He has had a long experience in dealing with the artists who produce spurious currency, and he can detect a bad coin or bill with both hands tied behind his back.

SURETIES NOT HELD VALUABLE

LABOR LEADERS STILL HELD BECAUSE FEDERAL OFFICERS DO NOT APPROVE OF THE BONDS OFFERED

CHICAGO, Jan. 20.—Additional surety for the bonds of Houlihan, Ryan, Shoupe, Reddin, Brown and McCain was offered in the federal circuit court of appeals today. The bonds of Bernhardt are en route.

United States District Attorney Miller stated today that the surety offered for Ryan, Houlihan and Shoupe was still unsatisfactory. The court will decide on the matter tomorrow.

This afternoon bonds for \$60,000 were submitted. The court indicated that the release of Brown and McCain would be ordered tomorrow, Miller saying the surety was satisfactory.
