Talleyrands Attended Gould Wedding



The Duke of Talleyrand, better known as Prince Helle of Sagan, his wife, formerly Anna Gould, and their young son attended the wedding of the duchess' older sister, Miss Helen Gould, and Finley J. Shepard. This is the first visit of the former Anna Gould to America since she divorced

her first husband, Count Boni de Castellane. Much interest attaches to the young son of the Talleyrands, who was a page at the wedding. The boy, now 4 years old, is a French-Russian duke. By succession he is Charles Maurice Pierre Jason Howard, Duke of Sagan.

PARIS, Jan. 24.—Leaving a note expressing his disappointment at being unable to marry the Virgin Mary, a madman committed suicide in a most determined manner at Epernay, France. He first placed a dynamite charge on his chest and exploded it, but the charge being too weak, he only inflicted frightful burns on himself. He then tried stabbing himself with a knife, but the weapon proved too blunt. Placing a large dynamite charge in his mouth, he lit the fuse and calmly awaited the explosion, which blew his head to pieces.

SUPERSTITION IS CAUSE ATROCITY

CRIMINALS MUTILATE BOYS AND USE THEIR FLESH FOR CANDLES TO MAKE THEMSELVES INVISIBLE

ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 24.—A horrible story of superstition and crime is reported from the village of Bichia, province of Nivgard. The mutilated bodies of two boys, aged 3 and 6 years, were found in a forest, and police inquiries showed that the crime had been committed by thieves, who utilized the flesh of their victims to make the candles which local superstition credits with the power of rendering criminals invisible and of aiding them to escape justice. Several arrests have been made.

MEDFORD, Jan. 24.—Curfew will ring again in Medford, according to announcement made by Mayor W. W. Kifer, and hereafter boys and girls under the curfew age will have to be home nights or explain to the police.
