**FOUR MILLION
WORK IN FRANCE**

**GOVERNMENT COMPILER FIG-
AN TO NUMBER OF WOMEN EM-
PLOYED IN REPUBLIC—MAJORITY
IN FACTORIES**

PARIS, Jan. 24.—The working
population of France includes 4,150,-
000 women and girls, according to an
official statement published here. Of
these 1,925,000 are employed in the
factories, workshops and transport
service, 1,275,000 in stores, business
offices, professions and public ser-
vice, and 649,000 in agriculture. The
vast number of working women come
under the head of "ouvriers" or work-
ers, which includes factory hands,
milliners, etc. Domestic servants total
172,000 and home workers 548,-
000 more.

workers will be depicted. Difficulty
