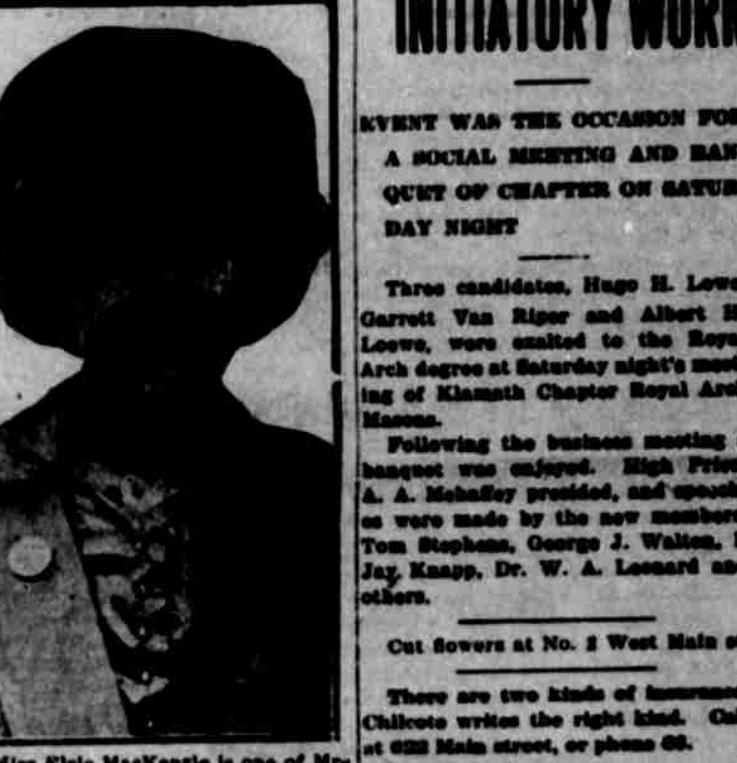

WELL ALONG WITH WORK ON PROJECT

DRIFTED BAD WEATHER, PRO-
GRESS WAS MADE IN DECEMBER
ACCORDING TO RECLAMATION
RECORD

The following report of work on
the Klamath project is published in
the current issue of the Reclamation
Record, the official publication of
that branch of the department of the
interior:

Klamath Project (74 per cent com-
pleted)—The weather during De-
cember was cloudy with occasional
rain and snow storms, but until the
26th permitted work to be carried on
by the contractors on the second unit
laterals. The precipitation was 1.65
inches, and the minimum tempera-
ture 15 degrees. The main canal
ditch at Olney crossing was com-
pleted, except for a few feet adjacent to
the concrete structure, which was de-
ferred until milder weather next
spring, when concrete work will be
resumed. The roads were bad for
heavy hauling, which made it impos-
sible to continue work with the trav-
eling excavator. Repair work on the
canals and laterals was completed
for the season. Some additional
program was made in procuring right
of way deeds, particularly in clearing
up long outstanding cases. The Lost
River diversion channel took the en-
tire flow of Lost River during the
month.

PROJECT FOLKS COSMOPOLITAN

EVERY STATE IN THE UNION IS
REPRESENTED AMONG NE-
BROKA RECLAMATION PROJECT
ENTRINEES IN BOARD

The population of nearly all of the
reclamation projects is cosmopolitan.
Nothing could more fully demon-
strate this than a recent census taken
on the Klamath project, where a
census of the 1,119 farmers showed
the following representation by state:

Ideals comes first, with 321, but as
Ideals is a new country most of these
settlers are not long absent from
other states. Then follow: Utah 99,
Montana 71, Colorado 63, Oregon 59,
Washington 58, Nebraska 56, Min-
nesota 56, Iowa 49, Kansas 37, Illinois

oming 13, Oklahoma 11, Indiana 11,
Ohio 10, Tennessee 7, Arkansas 7,
Michigan 6, South Dakota 6, Virginia
5, Canada 4, Wisconsin 4, West Vir-
ginia 4, Alaska 4, Arizona 3, Texas 3,
Pennsylvania 3, Kentucky 2, North
Dakota 2, Nevada 2, New York 2,
Rhode Island 1, Maine 1, North Car-
olina 1, New Mexico 1, New Mexico 1,
Panama 1, U. S. Army 1, and 63 not
reported.
