WEEKLY SERMON

The Conscience

By Rev. J. B. Stubbins, Pastor of the Presbyterian Church

"And herein do I exhort myself, wonderful revival of piety here in Klamath Falls, and lead to deeper knowledge of sin and higher ideals of holiness."

We pay little attention to conscience because it has been dethroned. It has no more power to compel the heart, the will or the intellect to listen than a dethroned king has to compel his people to obey his voice. The heart may get the consent of the will to indulge in desires that run counter to the conscience, then all the conscience can do is to enter a protest and weakly withdraw.

I know that the conscience can be smothered by unholy thoughts and unholy desires just as the most beautiful flowers of the garden may be smothered by the ugliest weeds, but I am pleading for the overthrowing of the conscience because it is God's gift to us, and has been dethroned by sin.

The fascinating power of the presence of moral leprosy and a pure conscience is described by Pope, in the following lines:

"Vice is a monster of such frightful mien
That to be hated needs but to be seen;
But, seen too oft, familiar with her face,
We first endure, then pity, then embrace."

February 12 is the Date Set for Oregon Pupils. Will Discuss Pending Bill for Extension Work

PORTLAND, Feb. 1.—Further expression to the sentiment in favor of "earth education" that is so strong throughout Oregon today, will be given February 12th, which has been made children's day in the country life movement. At that time schools of the state are expected to pay special attention to the subject of the development of Oregon's soil, the improvement of our farms and the betterment of country life generally.

Special programs will be arranged in the various schools and in many towns and villages parades will be held by school children. The slogan decided on for the occasion will be: "Better Farms Will Build the State." The idea to be worked out everywhere is that the movement to make better farms and to improve the farm homes of Oregon is a step that makes for the prosperity of all the people. Life on the farm, if made more profitable, will become more attractive and happier homes mean more contented people and an increased country population.

MAN DRAWS A SALARY FOR DIVING AWAY MONEY



Jerome D. Greene of New York is one of the four members of John D. Rockefeller's committee which handles the oil magnate's philanthropies.

Mr. Greene has been working to get the Peters bill granting the articles of incorporation to the Rockefeller foundation of \$100,000,000 through congress. The bill was passed by the house recently, and the senate will consider it shortly. Speaking of the purpose of Mr. Rockefeller in creating the foundation, Mr. Greene says:

"This is a foundation of charitable intent. The object is to promote the well being and to advance the civilization of the people of the United States in the acquisition and dissemination of knowledge, in the prevention and relief of suffering and in the promotion of eleemosynary and philanthropic means of any and all of the elements of human progress."

"The question of how the Rockefeller foundation is to spend its money is a legitimate one for the public to ask before the charter is granted, especially in the light of ignorant

members of congress who might seek the proceeds of a transfer for private rather than for public ends. This question is answered, first, by the unequivocal language of the charter, pledging the use of the money exclusively for charitable and humanitarian purposes, subject to the control of congress, and secondly, by the concrete illustration of how these same resources have been used while under private control through the general education board, the sanitary committee for the eradication of the hookworm disease, and the Rockefeller institute for medical research."
