CATHOLIC TRACK MEET ARRANGED

GAMES WILL BE HELD AT ROME IN SEPTEMBER—OVER FIVE THOUSAND PARTICIPANTS ARE EXPECTED

 ROME, Feb. 6.—As a result of the activities of Cardinal Merry del Val, papal secretary of state, announcement was made from the Vatican that the international games of the Federation of Catholic Gymnastic Societies will be held in Rome in September. Over 5,000 contestants from all over the world are scheduled to participate. Not only the credit for the coming international games given to Merry del Val, but he is also given credit for the entire awakening of interest by the Catholic church in athletic sports, the cardinal himself being an excellent rifle shot, tennis player, swimmer, carman, automobile and motor boat driver. It has been under his stimulus that nearly all of the Catholic athletic societies have been formed.

COVER D'ALENE WINNERS HELPED

NINETY-SIX WHO WERE SUCCESSFUL IN LAST BIG RUSH ARE RESTORED TO THEIR LEGAL RIGHTS BY NEW MEASURE

C., Feb. 6.—Winners in the 1909 drawing of lands on the Cover d'Alene Indian reservation in Northern Idaho, to the number of 96, are restored to the legal rights which they have abandoned by a bill introduced by Representative French of that state, this week. The 96 found the terms of payment for their homestead more severe than they could meet. Now they will share the extension of time for payment made to the people still on the land by a law passed last session.

FRANCE WILL HAVE ATHLETIC COLLEGE

REPUBLIC THUS HOPES TO DEVELOP BETTER TRACK MEN FOR OLYMPIAD—WILL TAKE MEN FROM ARMY

 PARIS, Feb. 6.—Stung by her poor showing at the Olympic games at Stockholm last year, and hoping for better results in 1916, France is preparing for the opening of her new College of Athletics here in April. It is proposed that each "student" be given \$1,000 expense money, and an effort is being made to induce the government to permit young men doing their compulsory military term to have leave of absence to attend the college, the time there counting as though on army service. It is said that the authorities look with favor on this project.

GETTSBURG TO BE SHOWN AT S.F.

COSTLY CYCLOPAMA WILL BE ONE OF THE ATTRACTIONS AT THE PANAMA-PACIFIC EXPOSITION IN 1915

 SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 6.—Famous artists will be brought from London and Paris to install "The Battle of Gettysburg," one of the most realistic battle cyclopanamas ever painted, which is to be one of the features of the concession section of the 1915 International exposition.

Director of Concessions Frank Burt states that this wonderful replica of the greatest battle of the civil war was painted by Paul Philippoteaux, a celebrated French painter, and is owned by Emmett W. McConnell, known as "The Panorama King," and who has been awarded the right to show "Gettysburg" and the "Evolution of the Brain" at the coming world's fair.

The canvas is 400 feet in circumference and 50 feet high, and covers an area of 20,000 square feet. It will be installed in a coliseum 125x150 feet and 65 feet high. Philippoteaux and sixteen artists worked for two years on this great painting.

EVEN OUR BUD IS GETTING THE GAFF

FISTIC SCRIBE OF THE LOS ANGELES TIMES CLAIMS NORTHERN LAD CAN'T TAKE THE HOT STUFF AND IS SLOW ON FEET

A sure sign that Bud Anderson of Vancouver, Wash., of Medford, Ore., of Klamath Falls, Ore., and now of Los Angeles, Calif., is coming to the fore in fistic circles in that section is shown by the fact that he is sufficiently far enough up the ladder in the opinion of at least one sport scribe to deserve a panning.

This scribe is DeWitt Van Court of the Los Angeles Times, and among the things he says about Anderson are the ones in the following paragraphs:

"Bud Anderson, the Vancouver light weight, has surely started the fight fans' tongues a-wagging in this town. The slam-bang fighter always makes them sit up and take notice. I do not mean by this that Bud is a slam-bang fighter, but it was Sammy Trotter, the slugger, that made them take notice of Bud.

"I had the pleasure of seeing Anderson box three exhibition rounds last Wednesday with his sparring partner, George Memie. It is impossible to judge a fighter's ability in exhibition bouts, but enough can be seen to get a fair knowledge of his cleverness. George was one of the toughest lightweights in the country in his day, and a good man to draw line from on any man he boxes with.

"Bud is the most powerful lightweight I have ever seen. He is well built from his feet up, very strong, a hard hitter, cool, and a fine looking fellow in every way. He may be the champion some day, but until he learns many things that there is to learn he will never win on his cleverness. He is neither a straight hitter nor a swinger. His blows are delivered more as hooks. He is not good on his feet, neither is he fast.

"I believe boys like Rivers and Ritchie would beat him. But he would have a better chance with Wolgast. Wolgast is easier to hit, and anybody Bud can hit he should easily lick. His judge of distance is not of the best, and a good fighter would keep him on his toes and off his balance most of the time. He is also open in the infighting and clinches.

"If I am not much mistaken, within another year Anderson will be in the welterweight class. He and Memie are built much alike and the weight question was always a trouble to George in the last couple of years he was fighting. Anderson claims to have had over forty fights. If this is true he should show much more cleverness."
