STORY OF HANDSOME MEN COME FROM PERU TO GUARD GIRLS

NATIVE RUBBER GATHERERS ARE SUBJECTED TO TERRIBLE INDIGNITIES BY CRUEL BRITISH MASTERS

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 10.—Revolutionary stories of inhuman treatment accorded native rubber gatherers in the Putuma district of Peru by agents of a British rubber company are told in a report by American Consul Stuart Fuller, sent to Congress by President Taft.

"Two hundred wild Barbadoes men," the report says, "were imported into Peru in 1904. Armed with Winchester rifles they were sent into the interior to enslave the docile natives. They murdered, flogged and tortured the Indians. Frequently the company's agents made an example of some savage whose rubber was not up to the mark. His right hand might be severed, he might be killed outright or strung up by the toes until he died."
