O. A. C. GROWTH IS REMARKABLE

STATISTICS IN BOARD OF REGENTS' BIENNIAL REPORT SHOW THE INSTITUTION HAS MADE GREAT GAIN

CORVALLIS, Feb. 12.—That an increase of 40 per cent in the short course enrollment at the Oregon Agricultural College is indicated by the registration to date, is one of the striking statements in the statistical portion of the biennial report of the board of regents, required by law, which is just off the press.

The students enrolled in 1910-11 were 1,778, and in 1911-12 they were 2,563. The geographical classification table in the report of the registrar shows that in 1910-11 all counties of Oregon were represented, and twenty-seven other states and territories, as well as nine foreign countries. The past year all of the counties of Oregon but one, thirty-six other states and eight foreign countries sent students.

Excluding the students in correspondence courses and other extension work, and omitting duplicates, the enrollment of students in 1910-11 was as follows: Regular matriculates 979, winter short courses 649, summer session 159, total 1,787; in 1911-12, regular matriculates 1,443, winter short course 1,532, summer session 143, total 3,118.

The registration for the present year is incomplete, as the second semester enrollment has not yet begun. On December 31, when the statistics for the report were put in final shape, the enrollment in all courses, excluding duplicates, was 1,959.

These included 1,357 in the regular courses, 98 in the summer session and 605 in the short courses, representing all the counties of Oregon, thirty-seven other states and territories and nine foreign countries.

OREGON PLATE STOLEN AGAIN

FOR THE THIRD TIME THE BRASS MARKER ON FLAGSTAFF AT EXPOSITION SITE HAS BEEN REMOVED BY RELIC HUNTERS

PORTLAND, Feb. 12.—For the third time the brass plate which the Oregon commission to the Panama-Pacific International Exposition at San Francisco has placed on the flagstaff which marks the site of the Oregon building on the fair grounds has disappeared—the work of vandals or relic hunters.

The first, which was put on on "Oregon First" day, about a year ago, when several hundred Oregonians attended the ceremony of selecting a site for the state building, was stolen the same night. The second was sent down from here about six months ago, and that disappeared about three months ago.

The third plate was bought by Julius L. Mier, president of the Oregon commission, and sent down there. Mr. Mier said today that he had not heard about its theft, and added:

"But if they like to take them away they are perfectly welcome. We'll get another and put that up. Maybe we better buy them by the gross, so we will have enough to last until the Oregon building is put up, and there is some way of protecting the memorial."

Another plate will be secured and forwarded in a few days.

WILL PLOW BIG TRACTS OF LAND

CHARLES W. SHERMAN, JR., IN SIGNING CONTRACTS FOR WORK TO BE PERFORMED WITH BIG GANG PLOW

Charles W. Sherman, Jr., of Dairy, who recently ordered a large traction engine and ten-share gang plow, is making contracts with many farmers for plowing this spring. Tuesday he closed a deal to plow 250 acres in the Crane and Elliott ranches in the Spring Lake country.

The plow and engine will be here in March, and Sherman will commence work as soon as the weather permits. With the outfit he can plow up to fifty or sixty acres a day.
