### INDIAN LEGENDS ARE RECALLED

WRITER IN LAKE COUNTY EXAMINER IS ENLIGHTENED TO CORRECT THE STORY SENT OUT BY PROF. HALLOCK OF BOSTON

A writer in the Lake County Examiner is inclined to credit the story sent out by Professor Hallock of Boston to the effect that this section was the Land of Noed. He calls attention to some of the legends of the Indians.

The writer continues:

Some of many ancient legends here, have been found throughout this whole section of the state, and what adds still more interest to the story of D. Hallock is the fact that there is among the Klamath Indians a legend to the effect that the Ark landed on the east side of Upper Klamath Lake. The spot was marked by painted signs on rocks just below the alleged landing place. The painted signs have been an object of interest to many tourists as well as people living in that vicinity, inasmuch as the rings appear brighter at certain times than at other, owing, perhaps, to atmospheric conditions. Aside from the legend the Indians profess entire ignorance of the rings, inasmuch as they have "always been there." The location of the rings is on a point of rocks about a mile and a half or two miles along the lake shore before the wagon road leaves the shore and goes across to Williamson River. Or at least such was the case before the Southern Pacific built its present line along the lake shore.

The writer has known of the legend concerning the landing of the Ark for a number of years, but never attached any significance to it. However, the discovery of Dr. Hallock leads additional interest to the question, and perhaps still further research will establish the fact that the Land of Cain and the City of Noed were our neighbors when the world was first created.

### PRICES FOR WOOL WILL BE HIGH

SHREKEMEN IN LAKE COUNTY ARE ENTHUSIASTIC OVER PROSPECTS FOR THE COMING WOOL SEASON

Relative to the wool market the opinion seems to be general that the prices will be fully as good as a year ago. However, there is no disposition to contract for wool on the sheep back, as was the case locally last year, but then there is no telling what Frank Rickey will do when he gets his neck bowed, says the Lake County Examiner.

Last year Mr. Rickey slipped in here with an auto, and before the general public was aware of the fact he had purchased a large number of clips at what was considered above the market price. Before the season closed he had purchased nearly all the Lake county wool, other buyers who has formerly been in the market, making no effort to check his onslaught.

Last year's crop was considered far above the average for wools in this section, owing to favorable range and weather conditions, but this year it promises to be even better. The sheep went into the winter in excellent condition, and everything has been favorable for them during the season that is now drawing to a close. A few weeks since some fear existed on account of heavy storms, but at the critical moment weather conditions changed and no ill effects whatever resulted. Manuel Sanders, the well known sheepman, a few days ago, came in from the desert, and he reports the sheep to be in better condition than he ever saw them before. He saw a great number of bands, and in every instance the sheep were in finest shape, with plenty of range to last them until shearing time. To an Examiner representative Mr. Sanders was positive in the statement that the crop of wool this coming spring would be the best that was ever marketed in Lake county. Such being the case, it is improbable that but one buyer will be in the local market when the buying season opens.
