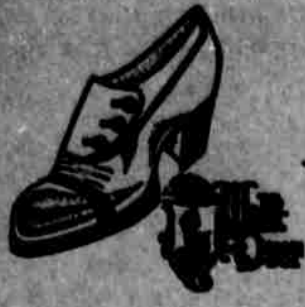

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 17.—The senate canal committee by a vote of five to three tabled the Root bill abolishing free passage and guarantee to American coastwise shipping in the Panama canal.

EXCLUSION BILL COMES UP AGAIN

STRICT MEASURE TO KEEP OUT ORIENTALS WILL COME UP WITHIN THE CURRENT YEAR, IN BELIEF OF SOLOH

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 17.—Chairman W. B. Wilson of the house committee on labor, who will probably be succeeded in that position next session by Representative Frank Buchanan of Chicago, says that a thorough-going Asiatic exclusion bill will be passed by both houses of congress before the end of the year, at the instance of the labor caucus. It is this group of seventeen union men in the new house to which John L. Nolan, secretary of the San Francisco Labor Council, and now to represent the Fifth California district, will belong. In the present session there are but fourteen members carrying union cards.

"Aside from the immigration problem affecting the Pacific coast," said Wilson today, "bills for which we expect to secure favorable action next session, if they are not passed by the senate before March 4, are the anti-injunction, the contempt, the seaman, and the officering and manning bills, the Bocher bill, regulating interstate shipment of convict-made goods, the dredger's eight-hour bill, the department of labor bill, and measures dealing with the stop-watch system in so-called scientific management on government work, and with the employment of enlisted men in competition with civilians on work for which men were not enlisted in the military and naval service."
