CITY AGAIN GETS COLONIST RATES

KLAMATH FALLS TO BE ONE OF THE TERMINALS IN THE THIRTY DAY HOMEMARKERS' RATE PERIOD

In connection with its announcement of colonist rates from points in the Middle West to Oregon, Washington and California, the Southern Pacific has made it known that homeseekers can this year purchase tickets direct to Klamath Falls. This is the second season with such an arrangement in favor of this city.

A few years ago Klamath Falls was not given the benefit of the colonist rate, and instead of buying tickets direct to this city, prospective settlers were compelled to pay transportation here from Portland or San Francisco. This caused many to abandon thoughts of Klamath Falls.

The fare to Klamath Falls, via Portland, from Kansas City and vicinity, will be \$20. From Chicago the fare will be \$25. The colonist rates will be in effect from March 15 to April 15.

MUCH PROGRESS AT FAIR GROUNDS

CONSTRUCTION WORK WELLS UNDER WAY AT SAN FRANCISCO. BUILDING WILL BE STARTED SOON

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 21.—Following is a resume of work done at the Panama-Pacific International Exposition site:

Reclamation of Barker Park and Friddle completed. More than 1,500,000 cubic yards of top soil removed.

Construction of sea wall completed along water front of the grounds. About 90 per cent. of two miles of site fenced.

Service building, first expansion structure, completed and occupied. Greenhouses and potting houses for exhibition horticulture and plants completed.

Asphalt roadway through East Main reservation built.

Four all-weather have been removed, besides seven of smaller structures. Gas robot houses removed.

North service avenue, 2,000 feet long, completed. Railway and street work, including bridge, in design and other preliminary sections, under construction.

Service avenue in design, 2,000 feet long, 50 feet wide, completed. South Garden avenue 50 feet wide, completed.

Wharves and bulkheads nearly completed.
