THREE PRISON AGENTS URGED TO ACT

Belief of Murdered Man Will Be Given in Military Funeral by Government Responsible for the Deaths—Foreigners Will Be Withheld by the United States Until the Criminals Are Punished

Lafferty Unable to Land an Appropriation

Democratic Majority in Congress Declines to Make a Suitable Appropriation for Crater Lake

The \$48,000 left over from last year's special appropriation and the \$20,000 appropriation of \$28,000 for maintenance and the regular appropriation of \$1,000 for maintenance, making a total of \$68,000, will be used to build a road from Crater Lake to the National Park this year. The chairman of the committee on Appropriations in the Democratic majority in Congress, Lafferty, has declined to make an additional \$100,000 appropriation for the road.
