While the mother was out of the room the youngster swallowed the entire bowl of mustard and hot water, and when a physician arrived to administer ipecac the boy stole the bottle and swallowed seven times an ordinary dose. To the utter astonishment of physician and family, the latter drug had no effect, and the human mortar is, to all appearances, in good health.

The lower snapshot shows Lieutenant Colonel Rubio Navarrete (the horseman) hurrying a field piece to an unprotected corner of the National Palace. Colonel Navarrete is in charge of the federal artillery, and has the reputation of being the most capable artilleryman in the Mexican army.

TIME FOR FILING OF REPORT AS TO MONKEY TRUST FINDS MEMBERS DISAGREEING AS TO THE REMEDY

C., Feb. 26.—How to control clearing houses, to anticipate evasions of reform legislation and whether federal regulations of the New York stock exchange is possible or advisable, are the knotty questions still unsettled by the Pujos money trust investigating committee. These points, it is learned, are the main obstacles to a unanimous report. February 25th is the date set for the submission of the report to the house. That a "money trust" actually exists will be a unanimous finding, according to several members. But the committee is far apart as to proposed remedies. Several bills covering the regulation of the trust will be sent to the house.
