THAW RETURNS TO MATTEWAN

LEARNING THAT TESTIMONY WAS TO BE USED IN BRIBERY SCANDAL PROBE, PROCEEDINGS ARE DROPPED

NEW YORK, March 6.—Learning today that the state proposed to use the proceedings before Supreme Justice Glagrich as a lever to disclose a bribery scandal, relatives of Harry Kendall Thaw, who are seeking to have him released, dropped the matter.

Special Prosecutor Jerome made strenuous objections to the motion for dismissal, and a prolonged wrangle ensued before Thaw was ordered returned to Mattewan asylum.

Thaw arrived this morning in custody of two detectives.

OVER 200 WOMEN ARE REGISTERED

TOTAL REGISTRATION FOR CITY ELECTION REACHED 1,944 LAST NIGHT—THREE MORE DAYS ARE LEFT

Since the registration books opened at the city hall Saturday, 257 voters have registered for Monday's charter election. Of this number, more than 200 are women.
